The Mission of CBAT

CBAT seeks to avoid adverse outcomes by diverting individuals with mental health issues to appropriate community services and behavioral health resources, by providing specialized training to CBAT officers and by focusing their scope of responsibilities.

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Mental Illness – Definition



Health condition characterized by alterations in <u>thinking</u>, <u>mood</u>, or <u>behavior</u> which impedes ability to function and perform day-to-day activities.



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Mental Illness:

What **Causes** a Mental Illness?

Causes may include:

- Biological factors
- Psychological factors
- Environmental factors





Causes

Biological factors

- Brain chemistry
- Brain injury or defect on certain areas of the brain
- Genetics
- Infections that impact the brain
- Prenatal factors (ex: high levels of cortisol during pregnancy, fetal trauma that results in oxygen deprivation, etc.)
- Substance abuse





Psychological factors

- Severe psychological trauma
- Loss
- Neglect
- Poor ability to relate to others

Environmental factors

- Death or divorce
- A dysfunctional family life
- Feelings of inadequacy, low self-esteem, anxiety, anger, or loneliness
- Changing jobs or schools
- Social or cultural expectations (For example, a society that associates beauty with thinness can be a factor in the development of eating disorder.)
- Chronic stress



Law Related to Mental Health

Lanterman-Petris (LPS) Short ACT

- Outlines the laws regarding involuntary commitments.
- WIC 5150 up to 72 hour hold for evaluation and treatment
- Based on danger to self, danger to others, and/or grave disability

WIC 5150 – Definition

Probable cause – the legal standard to determine if person meets criteria.

- Determining probable cause is a lay decision, not a clinical one
- Does <u>not</u> require a diagnosis

Mental disorder – not defined by law.

• The initiator of the hold must be able to articulate <u>behavioral symptoms</u> of mental disorder either temporary or prolonged.



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2015

Since 2015 the Riverside Police Department has committed and diverted officers, vehicles, and resources, from patrol to a collaboration between the **Riverside Police Department** and **Riverside County University Health System Resources**, to improve the response, care and lifestyle of the mentally ill, homeless and drug dependent.

Primary Goals

- Diversion from psychiatric inpatient hospitalizations
 - By providing screening, referral and linkage to lesser restrictive level of care
- Incarceration diversions
- Emergency department diversions
- Reduction in repeat law enforcement calls
- Appropriate linkage to care and resources
- Strengthen partnership and sense of unity between the community, LE and BH
