DISCUSSION CALENDAR

PROPOSED GRADE SEPARATION - EXISTING BURLINGTON NORTHERN SANTA FE RAILROAD CROSSINGS - SPRUCE, JACKSON, AND MARY STREETS - EXPLORE FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES - SPRUCE STREET GRADE SEPARATION

Following discussion it was moved by Member Perry and seconded by Vice Chair Hemenway to recommend that the City Council (1) approve the top three proposed Grade Separation Priority Ranking as follows: (a) Spruce Street, (b) Jackson Street, and (c) Mary Street at the Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) at-grade railroad crossing; and (2) direct the Public Works Department to explore funding opportunities to begin the Project Approval and Environmental Documents (PA&ED) phase of the Spruce Street grade separation. The motion carried unanimously.
