FAIR MAPS ACT

- 1. Specify criteria and deadlines for cities adjusting new district boundaries.
- 2. Specifies hearing procedures that would allow the public to provide input on placement of boundaries and on proposed boundary maps.
- 3. Public engagement (commissioners, website, translations, drawing of maps).


PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1. District Boundary Criteria
- 2. At least four public hearings:
 - Two before drawing a map
 - Two after draw maps are drawn (one during a weekend or after 6 p.m.)
- 3. Community Engagement
- 4. Reshape Riverside Website
- 5. Riverside must adopt district boundaries not later than 205 days before election: **August 2023**

MEMBER QUALIFICATIONS



Disqualifying Positions

For past 8 years (for commissioner or spouse) or past 4 years (for a commissioner's non-spouse family-member)

- 1. A person who is an **elected official** of the City
- 2. A family member, staff member, or paid campaign staff of an elected official of the City
- Officer, Employee, or Consultant for a candidate, campaign committee, or political party; or contributed \$500 or more to a Councilmember candidate
- 4. A registered **Lobbyist** in the City of Riverside



Qualifications

- Must be a resident of Riverside
- All members cannot be made up of one political party
- Cannot be candidate/or served on City
 Council for past 8 years (for commissioner or
 family member, 5 years after serving)
- Cannot participate in campaigns for Council while on the commission
- Cannot be hired by the city as employee or "no bid" consultant/contractor or run for elective office for 4 years
- Cannot be appointed to any other City commission for 2 years
