

COMMUNITY POLICE REVIEW COMMISSION SURVEY RESULTS

City Council October 12, 2021

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BACKGROUND

- On June 30, 2020, the City Council requested staff seek input from current and past Community Police Review Commission (CPRC) commissioner's in an effort to gain an understanding of Commissioners perspective on Commission activities and current level of support form the City for carrying out the Commission's mission and role.
- In August 2020 a 14 question survey was developed and distributed to commissioners.
- At the October 28, 2020 The CPRC requested the survey pool be expanded to include additional past commissioners.



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BACKGROUND

- On February 24, 2021 Survey results were presented to the Commission and the Commission requested to conduct a public workshop to receive input on activities, proposed activities, and composition of the CPRC.
- A Public Workshop was held during the April 28, 2021, CPRC meeting and continued at the May 26, 202, meeting.



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SURVEY

- Contained ten rating questions (scale of 1 5), three affirmative/opposed questions, and one open-ended question inviting additional feedback.
- Distributed to current Commissioners and Commissioners that have served on the CPRC in the last two to three years.
- In general, Commissioners felt they were granted the ability to carry out their powers, duties and functions as described in the Riverside City Charter and Riverside Municipal Code.



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SURVEY FEEDBACK

- Most questions were ranked in the four to five range with only three questions receiving at least one ranking of below a three.
- The lowest ranking question, whether the CPRC advised the Mayor and City Council on all police and community relations issues received an average score of 3.64.
- Overall, survey results indicated most Commissioners felt they had the resources needed to carry out the Commission's objectives.



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WORKSHOP FEEDBACK

- Upon review and discussion of the survey results, the Commission identified community outreach as a key component in meeting CPRC objectives.
- The COVID-19 Pandemic significantly impacted public interaction and allowed the Commission to identify post pandemic community outreach and Commission objectives.
- Among the recommendations, the Commission gave priority to the development and adoption of digital community outreach resources.
