SUBJECT: TECHNOLOGY COURT – REMOVAL OF NO PARKING ANY TIME ZONE AND ESTABLISHMENT OF TIMED NO PARKING ZONE

ISSUE:

The issues for Transportation Board consideration are: 1) removal of the existing No Parking Any Time Zone on the south side of Technology Court from Research Park Drive easterly to the cul-de-sac terminus; and 2) establishment of a Timed No Parking Zone within the same street segment.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Transportation Board recommend that the City Council approve:

1. Removal of the existing “No Parking Any Time” Zone on the southerly side of Technology Court from Research Park Drive easterly to the cul-de-sac terminus; and
2. Establishment of a “No Parking Between the Hours of 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Monday thru Friday and all day Saturday and Sunday” Zone on the southerly side of Technology Court from Research Park Drive easterly to the cul-de-sac terminus.

BACKGROUND:

The Public Works Department received a petition from 100% of businesses (5 of 5) on Technology Court requesting removal of the existing no parking any time restriction on both sides of Technology Court and establishment of a timed no parking zone to allow for on-street parking during typical business hours. Businesses indicate that the existing no parking restriction was previously implemented to address activities that were creating security and safety issues predominantly during the nighttime hours and on weekends. Growing business operations and periodic events at the facilities have created the need for on-street parking.

Due to the narrow 30-foot road width on Technology Court, the Public Works Department is proposing removal of the existing No Parking Zone and establishment of a Timed No Parking Zone only on the southerly side of Technology Court from Research Park Drive easterly to the cul-de-sac terminus.

Removal of the segment of existing no parking any time restriction on the southerly side of Technology Court would provide necessary additional on-street parking for area employees and business patrons during typical business hours while continuing to address overnight and

weekend security concerns.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The cost of sign removal and installation is nominal. Funding is available in the existing Public Works Department budget.
