ISSUE:

Receive and file a communications report for the month of December 2025 – January 2026.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Community Police Review Commission receive and file a communications report for the month of December 2025 to January 2026.

DISCUSSION:

December 9, 2025

- (1) City Council accepted additional funding from the Riverside County Probation Department in the amount of \$150,416.67, increasing total funding to \$547,416.67, to reimburse personnel, vehicle, and operational costs associated with Public Safety Realignment for the period of July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026. The action included a supplemental appropriation and required five affirmative votes. The City Council of Riverside, California, approved a resolution authorizing the City Manager, or designee, to execute a Standard Agreement with the State of California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control and accept a \$90,000 grant under the Alcohol Policing Partnership Program to enhance enforcement and reduce alcohol-related crimes from July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026.
- (2) City Council awarded Bid No. 8204 to R.E. Chaffee Construction, Inc. for the installation of an above-ground fuel tank at the Police Aviation facility located at Riverside Municipal Airport. The project was approved for a total amount of \$861,599, including contingency, funded by the Measure Z City Buildings Annual Deferred Maintenance account. Approved an agreement with American Forensic Nurses, Inc., La Quinta, for biological evidence collection services through June 30, 2028, at \$110,000 annually, not to exceed \$330,000, funded by the General Fund, Police Administrative Services Professional Services Account.

January 6, 2026

- (1) City Council approved an obligation document for overtime reimbursement related to the Regional Fugitive Task Force with the United States Marshals Service, in an amount not to exceed \$189,000 from the Grants and Restricted Program Fund. The action included a supplemental appropriation and covers the period through September 30, 2026.
- (2) City Council approved Memorandums of Understanding with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives to support participation in the National Integrated Ballistic Information Network and the performance of ballistic evidence correlation reviews.
