SUBJECT: SPEED LIMIT ZONE ESTABLISHMENT ON ESSEX STREET – ORDINANCE

ISSUE:

The issue for City Council consideration is establishment of a 35 mile per hour (MPH) speed limit on Essex Street from Mountain View Avenue to Central Avenue.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council introduce and adopt an ordinance to establish a 35 MPH speed limit zone on Essex Street from Mountain View Avenue to Central Avenue.

BOARD RECOMMENDATION:

On May 6, 2015, the Transportation Board (Board) reviewed this matter; seven of nine members were present. The Board unanimously recommended establishment of the proposed 35 MPH speed limit zone on Essex Street from Mountain View Avenue to Central Avenue.

BACKGROUND:

Residents on Essex Street from Mountain View Avenue to Central Avenue have expressed concerns regarding speeding within their neighborhood. Existing 25 MPH signage is in place on the street; however, this stretch of roadway is classified as a two-lane collector street requiring a speed survey to determine the appropriate maximum speed for this section of Essex Street and allow for establishment of an enforceable speed limit.

The Public Works Department conducted a Traffic and Engineering Survey which concluded the 85th percentile speed to be 41 MPH. As a result of survey findings and roadway conditions including dirt shoulders, variations in road width, and limited sight distance due to curvilinear alignment, the Public Works Department is proposing establishment of a 35 MPH speed limit on Essex Street from Mountain View Avenue to Central Avenue.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The cost of sign removal and installation is nominal. Funding is available in the existing Public Works Department budget.
