


ARFON WAY – REMOVAL OF PILOT PROJECT TEMPORARY IMPROVEMENTS & INSTALLATION OF PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS

BACKGROUND

 Arfon Way and University Ave. residents raised traffic speeds and volumes concerns resulting from cut-through traffic bypassing the signal at Mission Inn Ave. and Redwood Dr.;

- Initial mitigation measures included:
 - 1. Police enforcement;
 - 2. Curve warnings w/ advisory speeds; and
 - 3. "No Right Turn" during peak a.m. / p.m. commute hours on eastboundMission Inn Ave. at Arfon Way.





BACKGROUND (CONTINUED)

- Residents continued to report cut-through traffic and violations of the posted turn restrictions; and
- A 6-month traffic circulation pilot project was proposed:
 - 1. Utilize temporary materials to limit movements on Arfon

Way to egress only; and

2. Allow for assessment of project impacts prior to considering permanent improvements.








PILOT PROJECT APPROVAL & IMPLEMENTATION

- 8/1/18 the Transportation Board approved the proposed 6-month traffic circulation pilot project;
- 9/18/18 the City Council approved the proposed pilot project;
- 10/31/18 Temporary traffic circulation pilot project improvements were installed on Arfon Way at Mission Inn Ave.; and
- Improvements included removal of the timed peak hour "No Right Turn" restrictions on eastbound Mission Inn Ave. at Arfon Way to "No Right Turn" at all times.

PILOT PROJECT ASSESSMENT OF IMPACTS

 Post pilot project 24-hr. speed counts show notable traffic volume and speed improvements (2023):

PILOT PROJECT ASSESSMENT OF IMPACTS (CONTINUED)

 Post pilot project count data (2023) showed notable reductions in traffic volumes and speeds;

 Solid Waste Division reported no impacts to trash pick-up or street sweeping services; and


 Fire Department findings stated that conversion to permanent improvements would not hinder their response in any way.



CONCLUSION

- Based on pilot project assessments Public Works recommended permanent improvements (curb ramp and sidewalk);
- Project funding as part of Traffic Improvements for the 2023-2024 Paving Projects (CIP).
