Table 1 – RMC 14.12 Ordinance – Notable Revisions

Section	Description
14.12.225	<p>Monitoring Included language to require compliance with 40 CFR 136, to require self-certification of representative sampling methods, and to clarify requirements for facilities to receive samples split from City samples.</p>
14.12.245	<p>Water Softeners Updated language to clearly distinguish between residential use of water softeners and the prohibition against commercial or industrial use.</p>
14.12.295	<p>Liquid Waste Haulers Updated to expand types of wastes the City can accept from haulers, to include food wastes, FOG or ADM, or other renewable resources.</p>
14.12.316	<p>Reduction of Pollutants in Stormwater Included language to provide for diversion of dry weather flows from the storm sewer system to the sanitary sewer and guidelines for design of these systems.</p>
14.12.357	<p>Dental Industrial User Updated language to comply with 40 CFR 441, federally promulgated regulations, and One-Time Certification requirements.</p>
14.12.385	<p>Industrial and Commercial Stormwater Requirements Updated language to provide for additional stormwater management options, including diversion, impounding and resource renewal.</p>
14.12.400	<p>Slug Discharges Included language to require mitigation actions by facilities in the event of a spill or release, to prevent release of restricted materials to the environment.</p>
14.12.435	<p>Wastewater Discharge Authorization Certificate (WDAC) Simplified the language regarding qualifications for this certificate.</p>
14.12.475	<p>Fees and Charges Simplified language regarding conditions for customers to be considered industrial or commercial, and to be charged a sewer rate or special billing.</p>
14.12.520 / 14.12.545	<p>Administrative Orders and Criminal Penalties Updated language to make fines and penalties consistent with state law limitations.</p>
14.12.550	<p>Probationary Periods Provided for extensions of probationary periods in cases where the user commits the same violation within the probationary period.</p>
