SUBJECT: COMMUNITY POLICE REVIEW COMMISSION - COMMUNITY OUTREACH

ISSUE:

Discuss events the Community Police Review Commission (CPRC) can attend throughout the community for outreach and participation.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

BACKGROUND:

On July 26, 2023, the CPRC convened to deliberate on the establishment of an Ad Hoc Committee dedicated to community outreach. Chair Berrellez appointed Commissioner DeBrier, who accepted the responsibility as Chairman of the Ad Hoc Committee. Commissioners Huerta and Gutierrez also volunteered to join the committee. However, on March 1, 2014, Commissioner Huerta's term on the commission concluded, leaving the Ad Hoc Committee below its required minimum of three members.

On July 24, 2024, the commission revisited the community outreach Ad Hoc Committee membership and Chair Berrellez appointed Commissioner DeBrier as chairman and Commissioners Gutierrez and Prince volunteered to be members of the committee.

DISCUSSION:

The purpose of the Ad Hoc Committee is to educate the public on the role of the CPRC, build relationships with the community by gathering feedback based on the community's concern, and report back to the commission regarding community insight, concerns, and ideas for future engagement.

This body is to discuss and agree on the events and materials to be used by the Ad Hoc Committee for their outreach.
