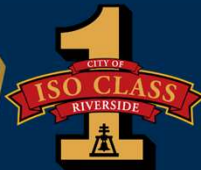

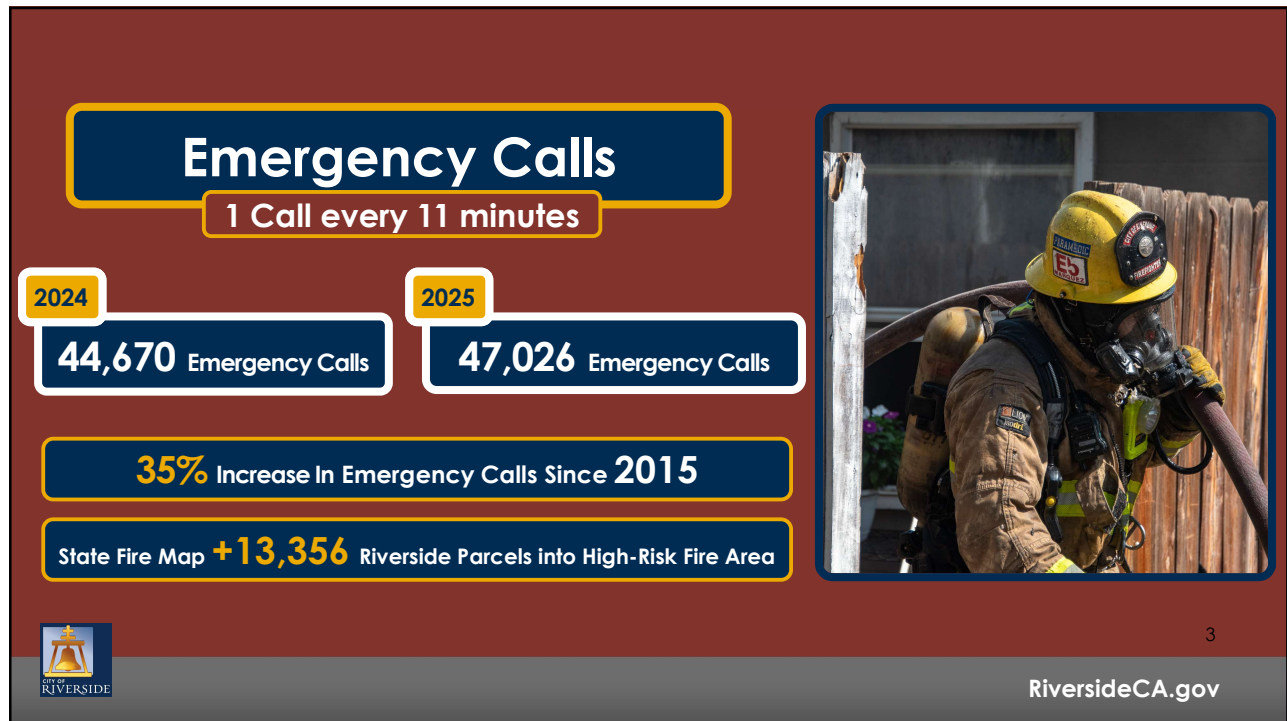

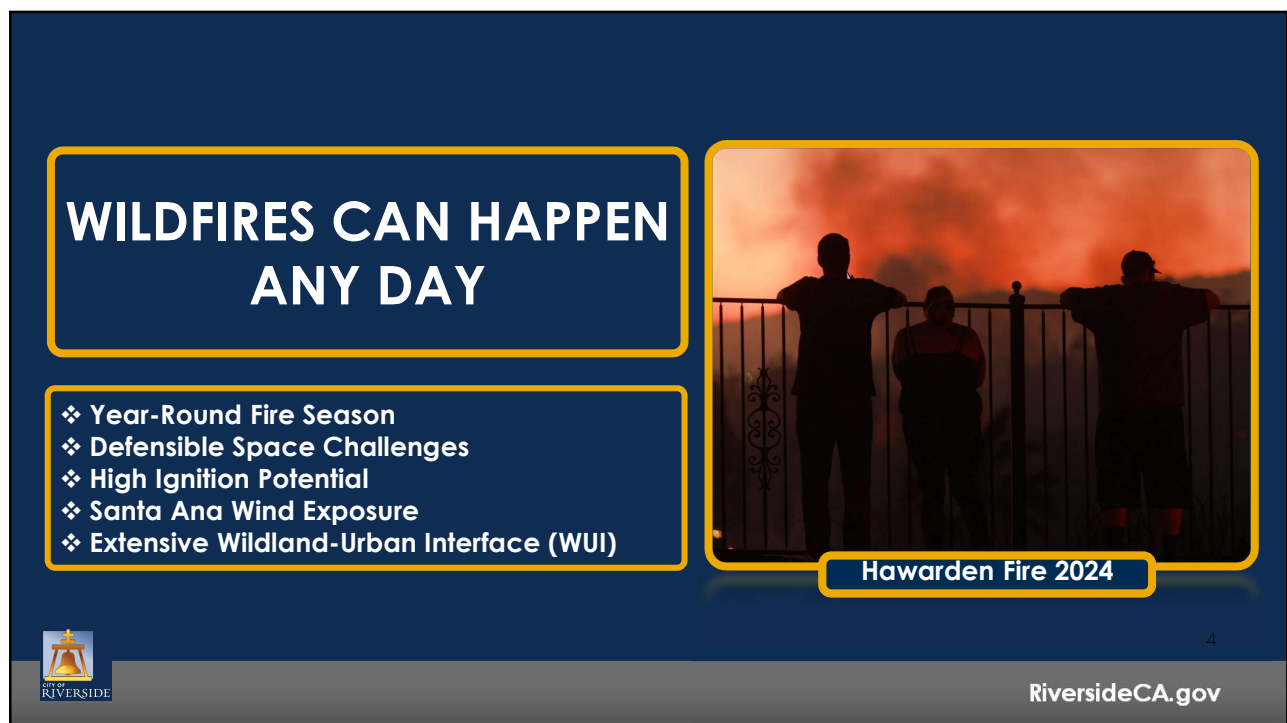
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RIVERSIDE RESILIENCE..PULLING TOGETHER FOR WILDFIRE PREPAREDNESS!

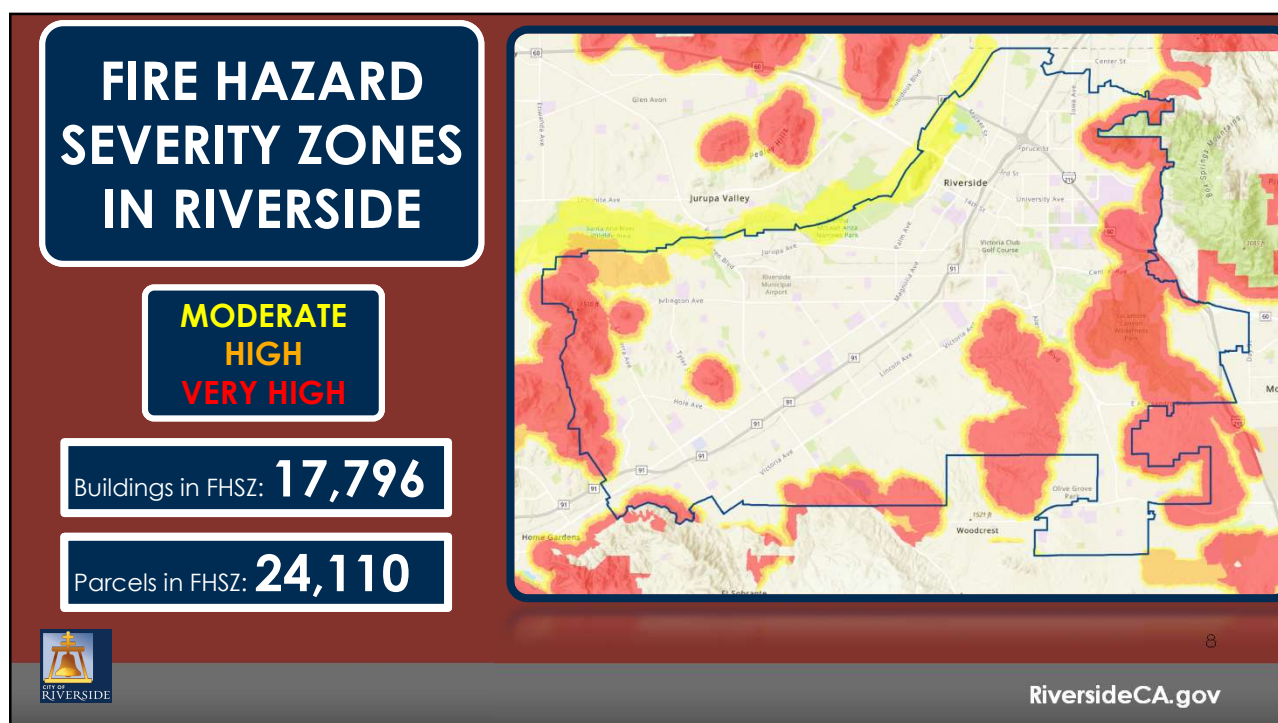

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DEFENSIBLE SPACE

The Immediate Zone: 0-5 Feet

The home and the area furthest attached exterior point of the home.

The Intermediate Zone: 5-30 Feet

The furthest exterior point of the home.

The Extended Zone: 30-100 Feet

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ZONE 0

The Immediate Zone: 0-5 FT.



What to do?

- ❖ Avoid using wood mulch.
- ❖ Remove dead plants, dry leaves, and pine needles from the ground, roof, and gutters.
- ❖ Keep firewood, propane tanks, and other flammable items at least 5 feet away from structures.
- ❖ Use fire-resistant building materials for fences, decks, and siding.



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ZONE 1

The Intermediate Zone: 5-30 FT.



What to do?

- ❖ Keep grass mowed and green.
- ❖ Avoid using wood mulch.
- ❖ Create clear walkways.
- ❖ Trim back branches that hang over the roof or touch the house.
- ❖ Use fire-resistant building materials for fences, decks, and siding when possible.




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ZONE 2

The Extended Zone: 30-100 Feet



What to do?

- ❖ Thin out vegetation.
- ❖ Keep good spacing between tree canopies.
- ❖ Maintain other structures on property.
- ❖ Use fire-resistant building materials for fences, decks, and siding.


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HAZARDOUS VEGETATION

**Riverside Municipal Code
Chapter 6.16**

*Vegetation Management and
Defensible Space*

Any vegetation native or ornamental that is dead, dying, overgrown, unmanaged, or otherwise maintained in a condition that creates a fire hazard or contributes to the spread, intensity, or ignition potential of a wildland fire.


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ACCEPTABLE VEGETATION




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DEFENSIBLE SPACE INSPECTION PROGRAM

Who it Applies To

All owners of property in the High and Very High hazard severity zones will be notified by mail around June of pending inspection (seasonal dependent).

How Long It Will Take

Inspections will occur 30+ days after notification.

Violation Notice

Parcels in violation will be referred to Code Compliance for abatement.

Gross violations will be referred to Code Compliance for abatement.




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VEGETATION MANAGEMENT ENFORCEMENT

Riverside Municipal Code Chapter 6.16

Vegetation Management and Defensible Space



Property owners are **REQUIRED** to:

- ❖ Maintain defensible space around structures by reducing, clearing, or modifying vegetation.
- ❖ Remove dead, dying, or overgrown vegetation, ladder fuels, and combustible plant material.
- ❖ Ensure vegetation does not obstruct roadways, impair visibility, or interfere with emergency response.
- ❖ Manage parcels to prevent conditions that allow wildfire to spread rapidly between structures or open-space areas.

Submit your Home Assessment Program application through the City's 311 website or App.


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AB38 FIRE INSPECTIONS

When selling your home, a fire inspections is **REQUIRED** for properties in High or Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zones.

Sellers must provide proof of compliance to buyers before escrow closes or agree in writing to complete it after.

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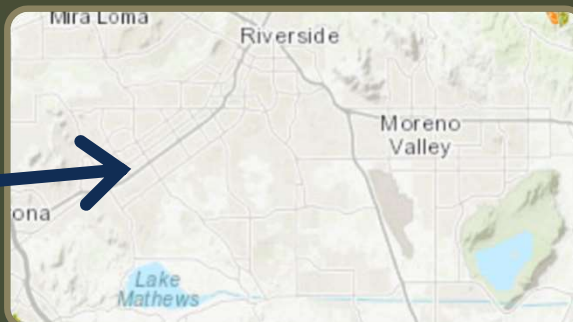
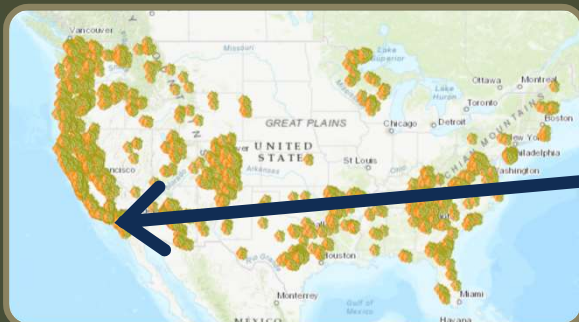
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FIREWISE USA MAP
