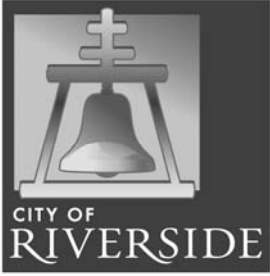

<p>Councilmember Melendrez disqualified himself from participation in the following item as he owns property within 500 feet and left the dais.</p> <p>CITY ATTORNEY OFFICE EXPANSION - 3750 UNIVERSITY - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION - CONTINUED</p> <p>Following discussion, the City Council continued for no more than three months the funding request for the City Attorney's Office expansion for an additional 2,534 square feet of office space located at 3750 University Avenue.</p> <p>Councilmember Melendrez returned to the dais as this time.</p> <p><u>PUBLIC HEARINGS/PLANNING REFERRALS AND APPEALS</u></p> <p>CASE P18-0606 - ZONING CODE AMENDMENT - WATER EFFICIENT LANDSCAPE AND IRRIGATION - ORDINANCE INTRODUCED</p> <p>Hearing was called to consider an ordinance amending Title 19 of the Riverside Municipal Code, Chapter 19.570 - Water Efficient Landscape and Irrigation, to conform to State requirements for water efficient landscaping and re-establish the Water Efficient Landscape and Irrigation Ordinance provisions previously approved by the City Council and unintentionally altered by a subsequest approval. No one spoke on the matter. The public hearing was officially closed. CASE P18-0673 - CITY LANDMARK - THE HARBOR RESIDENCE - 3014 PINE - RESOLUTION
 Hearing was called on the request by Lori Stephenson to designate "The Harbor" single-family residence, located at 3014 Pine Street, as a City Landmark. No one spoke on the matter. The public hearing was officially closed. Following discussion, the City Council (1) determined that Planning Case P18-0673 (City Landmark Designation) is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15308 as it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment and that said action is intended to preserve the historic character of the building and to provide notice of the historic status; (2) approved Planning Case P18-0673 based on, and subject to, the Cultural Heritage Board facts for findings outlined in the Cultural Heritage Board staff report; and (3) adopted a resolution designating "The Harbor" located at 3014 Pine Street, as a City Landmark; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23406 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Approving the Application Under Planning Case Number P18-0673 Designating "The Harbor" Residence Located at 3014 Pine Street, as a City Historic Landmark, was presented and adopted.

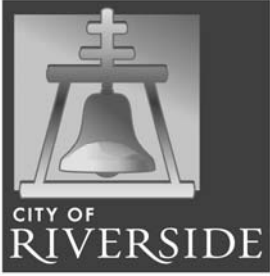

Girl Scout Troop 520 led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

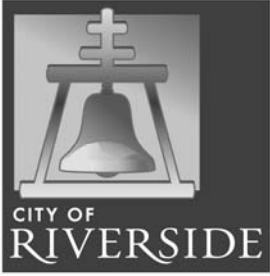
MAYOR/COUNCILMEMBER COMMUNICATIONS

AGREEMENT - COPIER, PRINTER, AND MANAGED PRINT SERVICES
The City Council (1) approved a five-year Agreement, Request for Proposal (RFP) 1817, with Sharp Electronics Corporation, Santa Ana, in an amount not-to-exceed \$2,167,172 from various departmental general office and printing expense accounts, as the City's primary copier, printer, and managed print service provider; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute all documents pursuant to the Managed Print Services Agreement, including but not limited to the Agreement, Master Lease Agreement, Customer Care Maintenance Agreements (orders), Master Lease Agreement Schedule, and related financing documents, Equipment Delivery Acceptance forms, and make minor non-substantive changes including the execution of annual renewals subject to available budget.

DONATION OF CITY VEHICLE
The City Council approved Mayor Bailey and Councilmember Gardner's recommendations to (1) declare City vehicle, Asset ID C1038, 2007 Chevrolet Tahoe, Vehicle Identification Number 1GNFC13057R333956, as surplus to the City's needs; and (2) authorize the donation and transfer of the City vehicle, Asset ID C1038, to Path of Life Ministries to support the organization's mission to end homelessness in Riverside.

NAMING OF UNIVERSALLY ACCESSIBLE PLAYGROUND AT FAIRMOUNT PARK - 2601 FAIRMOUNT
The City Council approved the request to name the Universally Accessible Playground at Fairmount Park located at 2601 Fairmount Boulevard in honor of James Nichols Stream.

OFFICIAL POLICE TOW TRUCK SERVICE - ORDINANCE ADOPTED
The City Council adopted an ordinance of the City of Riverside,

<p>amending Chapter 5.15 of the Riverside Municipal Code entitled regulation of Riverside Police Official Police Tow Truck Service to maximize community service and provide a fair process to uphold regulations; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Ordinance No. 7452 of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Chapter 5.15 of the Riverside Municipal Code Entitled Regulation of Riverside Police Official Police Tow Truck Service, was presented and adopted.</p> <p>5-TON WEIGHT LIMIT RESTRICTION - GREEN ORCHARD - ORDINANCE INTRODUCED The City Council introduced an ordinance to establish a five-ton weight limit restriction on Green Orchard Place from Kingdom Drive to Crystal View Terrace; whereupon, an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Section 10.56.020 of the Riverside Municipal Code Designating the Restriction of Commercial Vehicles for Certain Streets and Portions Thereof to Establish 5-Ton Weight Limit Restrictions on Green Orchard Place from Kingdom Drive to Crystal View Terrace," was presented and introduced.</p> <p>30-MINUTE PARKING ZONE REVISION - MARKET - RESOLUTION The City Council adopted a resolution to revise the existing 30-minute parking zone on the west side of Market Street from Sixth Street to Mission Inn Avenue to change the zone duration from "9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Except Saturday, Sunday, and Holidays" to "6 a.m. to 10 p.m. Daily;" whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23408 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Resolution No. 22451 Known as the Master Parking Schedule Resolution to Revise the Existing 30-Minute Parking Zone Duration on Market Street, was presented and adopted.</p> <p>CASE EPW-18-001 - MONROE MASTER DRAINAGE PLAN LINE E STAGES 2 AND 3, LINE E-2, AND LINE E-5 STORM DRAIN IMPROVEMENTS The City Council (1) found the proposed project will not have a significant effect on the environment based on the analysis and mitigation set forth in the case record and adopted a Mitigated</p>

Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program; and (2) approved Public Works Department Case EPW-18-001 to construct 2.12 miles of underground storm drain pipes and ancillary structures within Gratton Street from Lincoln Avenue to Hermosa Drive, Dufferin Avenue from Gratton Street to Adams Street, and Hermosa Drive from Gratton to St. Lawrence Streets, as outlined in the written staff report to address frequent flooding within the area.

SPEED LIMIT ZONE - HERMOSA/WASHINGTON/ MONROE - ORDINANCE INTRODUCED

The City Council introduced an ordinance to establish a 25 MPH speed limit zone on Hermosa Drive from Washington to Monroe Streets; whereupon, an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance of the City of Riverside, California Amending Section 10.76.010 of the Riverside Municipal Code Designating the Prima Facie Speed Limits for Streets and Portions Thereof in Accordance with the Provisions of Sections 10.20.020 and 10.20.030," was presented and introduced.

LICENSE AGREEMENT - BICYCLE SHARE STATION AND SHELTER - DOWNTOWN RIVERSIDE METROLINK STATION - 4066 VINE

The City Council (1) approved a no-cost License Agreement with Riverside County Transportation Commission, Riverside, California, for installation, operation, and maintenance of bike facilities including a share station and shelter at the Downtown Riverside Metrolink Station located at 4066 Vine Street; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the License Agreement with Riverside County Transportation Commission, including making minor and non-substantive changes.
