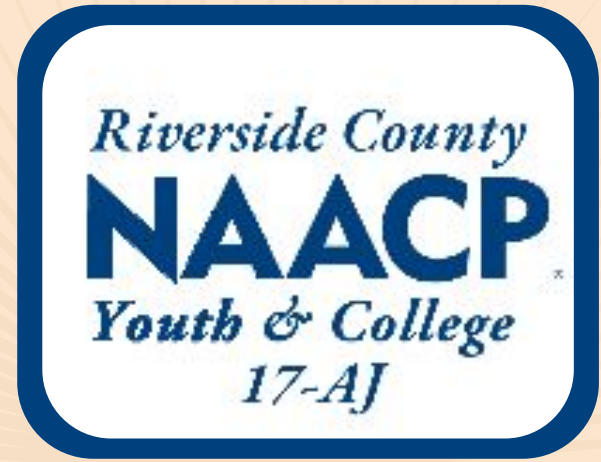


# Riverside County NAACP Youth Council 17-AJ

## Mentorship and Support

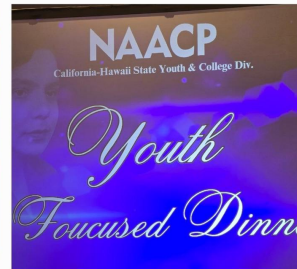
Connecting young people with mentors who guide and inspire them to pursue their goals and become effective change agents.

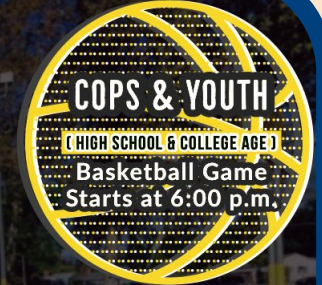
