 - Foothill AIDS Project \$1,169,194
 - Administration \$ 87,689

- May 31, 2019: Release of Draft Plan for Public Review
- July 2, 2019: Public Hearing
- July 8, 2019: Submit Action Plan to HUD



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RECOMMENDATIONS

That the City Council:

1. Adopt the 2018-2019 Annual Action Plan (Plan) for expenditures of CDBG, ESG, HOPWA and HOME funds;
2. Authorize City staff to make any necessary changes to funding recommendations for potentially funded CDBG, ESG, HOPWA, and HOME sub-recipients when a final allocation amount is received and finalize the Plan for submittal to HUD;
3. Authorize the preparation and execution of the standard CDBG, ESG, HOPWA and HOME Agreements with the City's grantees as identified in the Plan;



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RECOMMENDATIONS (CONT.)

4. Authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute the HUD grant agreements for the CDBG, ESG, HOPWA and HOME programs and the agreements with the City's grantees as identified in the Plan, including making minor, non-substantive changes; and
5. Authorize the appropriation of funds for City Departments receiving funding to the appropriate accounts established by the Finance Department.



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
