What is Redistricting

Definition

Redistricting is the process of adjusting ward lines every 10 years after the release of the U.S. Census. The well-known examples are Congressional and State Legislative Districts, but local governments also must do redistricting.

- Just like we did 10 years ago, the City of Riverside must go through this process again to rebalance the city council wards using the 2020 Census Data.
- Beyond creating wards of equal population, redistricting also serves to empower local communities and preserve voting rights.

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Required Redistricting Criteria

Ranked criteria that must be followed in city redistricting

There are a number of criteria that are required under the FAIR MAPS Act (ranked):

- Relatively equal size - people, not citizens
- Contiguous – wards should not hop/jump
- Maintain “*communities of interest*”
- Easily identifiable and understandable lines, following city, natural, and man-made boundaries
- Keep wards compact – appearance/function

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Communities of Interest

Three Critical Questions in Defining YOUR Community

- Does the community have a shared culture, characteristics or bond?
- Is the community geographic in nature? Is the community able to be mapped?
- How would you describe the community's relationship with the jurisdiction and how it is affected by the policy decisions made by the elected officials?

1. Help shape the future of City of Riverside City Council wards.
Every five years, U.S. Census data is used to redraw City of Riverside's City Council ward boundaries. To ensure the wards are redrawn for change in population, the City Council wants to hear from you on how these boundaries should be drawn. Complete this form to tell the City Council about your community of interest, helping communities of interest together in a high-ranking effort in the re-districting process.

2. What is a Community of Interest?
A Community of Interest is a group of people in the same geographically definable area who share common social and economic interests. Some examples of Communities of Interest are:

- Senior citizens
- LGBTQIA+ communities
- College students living near campus
- People who live downtown or in a neighborhood
- Religious community
- Residents who share a common language
- People that use the same transportation system

3. What criteria will help the City Council understand the importance of your community in the re-districting process?
When defining your community, it is important to answer the following questions to assist the City Council in the re-districting process:

1. Does your community have a shared culture, characteristics, or bond?
2. Is your community geographically in nature? Is your community able to be mapped? Is there already an existing community?
3. How would you describe your community's relationship with the City, and how it is affected by policy decisions made by the City Council?

The public can submit any testimony, but it is important to remember that your input can be best used if it addresses all three of these questions.

4. What can you do to further participate in the re-districting process?
Provide your comments on your community of interest to ReshapeRiverside@riversideca.gov, sending the form to the City Clerk, or attend a public hearing and read your comments to the Council.

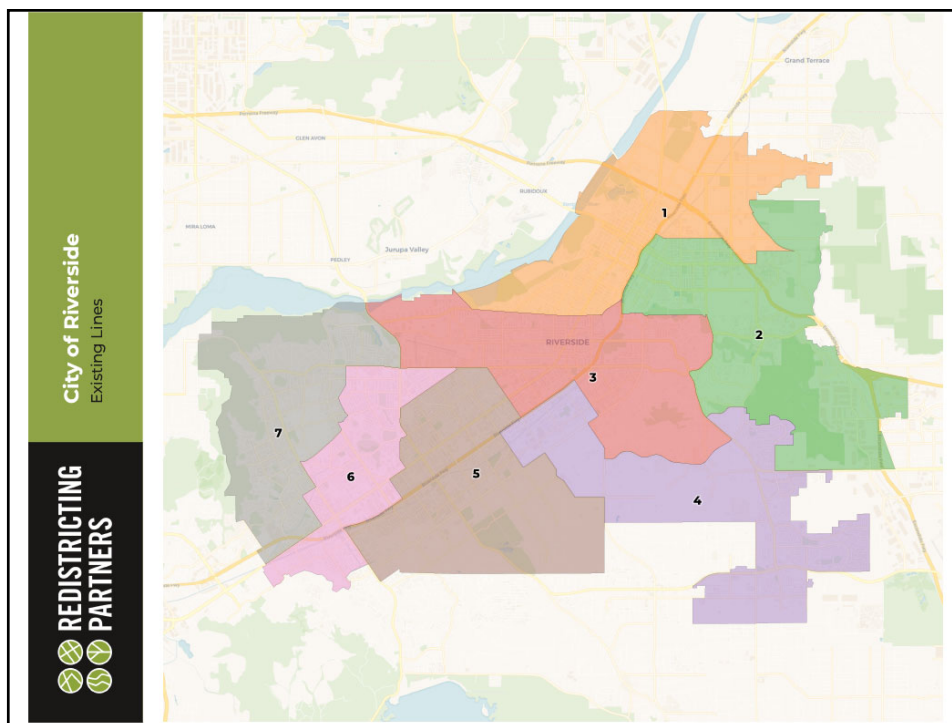
