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Legislative History & Background

- Riverside Municipal Code 5.66 "Ambulances":
 - Outlines how the City of Riverside Fire Department manages Franchise (911) and Interfacility Transports (IFT) ambulance transports within its jurisdiction.
- Riverside County Emergency Medical Services Agency (REMSA):
 - REMSA and American Medical Response entered into a County wide agreement in 2015 to provide Advance Life Support ambulance services, which made AMR the solo ALS provider for Riverside County.
- City of Riverside and American Medical Response:
 - City of Riverside & AMR 2018 Franchise Agreement has expired on June 30, 2023, with the Operational Agreement on November 8, 2023.



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Discussion / Application Review

- Franchise Application Review:
 - o RMC 5.66.040 Processing Application:
 - Prerequisites for a new Franchise Agreement or extension, the applicant (AMR) must fill out an
 application for review by the Administrator. After review, the Administrator shall submit a
 report to the Committee to consider the report and hear testimony.
 - o Riverside County EMS Agency (REMSA) Review:
 - o REMSA Contractual Renewal: Did not earn.
 - Did not meet the minimum (90%) or enhanced (91%) response time performance for the months of February, March, May and June 2022.
 - · Did not submit of monthly compliance reports within 15-days of the end of each month.
 - Submitted an incomplete annual report (missing five-months of data).
 - Non-Compliant with ALS mandate, sending Basic Life Support (BLS) ambulances to Advance Life Support (ALS) calls outside of the Emergency Medical Dispatch program approved by REMSA.



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Discussion / Application Review cont.

- Riverside City Subzone:
 - Within the Riverside Zone, AMR did meet the 90% adjusted compliance with the delayed response exemptions.
 - AMR was non-compliant with the ALS mandate, sending BLS ambulances to ALS level calls, which is outside of the current 2018 ALS First Responder Agreement (AMR & City of Riverside).
 - CY2022: Total of 1,403 incidents BLS ambulance responded in the City of Riverside requiring a City of Riverside Fire Department paramedic to provide ALS care with the BLS ambulance.
 - CY2023: 230 BLS ambulances to-date that have responded in the City of Riverside requiring a City of Riverside Fire Department paramedic to provide ALS care with the BLS ambulance.
 - o Delayed Responses:
 - AMR was delayed on 5,813 incidents per RFD Computer Aid Dispatch. REMSA found 2,198 to be delayed. AMR cited hospital delays.
 - 44,299 total incidents with AMR responding to 37,148 in Riverside Zone.



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Discussion / Application Review cont.

- City of Riverside Contract Review:
 - o Breach of Contract Letter:
 - March 14, 2023, Breach of Contract letter was sent to AMR due to delayed response for non-payment during the 2022 billing cycle.
 - AMR did not submit Response Time Standards for Services quarterly as stated in the 2018 ALS First Responder Agreement in Schedule "A" Section IV.
 - o AMR was non-compliant with the ALS mandate, sending BLS ambulances to ALS level calls, which is outside of the current 2018 ALS First Responder Agreement.
- Customer Service Surveys:
 - o The three main area hospitals and ten convalescent hospitals were served. In all cases, facilities were satisfied with the services AMR provided.
- Commission of Accreditation of Ambulance service (CAAS):
 - Current



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Strategic Plan Alignment / Fiscal Impact

- Strategic Priorities:
 - Strategic Priority Number 2: Community Well-Being
 - Goal 2.6 Strengthen community preparedness for emergencies to ensure effective response and recovery.
- Fiscal Impact:
 - RMC Section 5.66.030: AMR has paid the Franchise Application Fee of \$1,858.00.



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Recommendations

That the Safety Wellness, and Youth Committee:

- 1. Review and discuss the Medical Transport Franchise Application submitted by American Medical Response Ambulance Service, Inc.;
- 2. Recommend the City Council consider the approval of a First Amendment to the 2018 Advanced Life Support First Responder Agreement;
- 3. Recommend the City Council consider the adoption of a Resolution to extend the term of the franchise with American Medical Response Ambulance Service, Inc. for a six-month term with one six-month option to extend; and
- 4. Recommend the City Council authorize the City Manager or designee to execute the First Amendment to the 2018 Advanced Life Support First Responder Agreement, including making minor and non-substantive changes including any options to extend.



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
