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BACKGROUND

Offered since 1999

Program Goals:

- 1. Conserve energy (163 kWh/tree)
- 2. Reduce summer cooling costs
- 3. Enhance the City's green spaces

RPU electric customers:

\$40 per qualified shade tree

Customers receive up to six trees

- 1. Five trees through regular rebate
- 2. One through March back of bill




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SOFTWARE TO MANAGE TREE POWER

Support for the Administration of Current Program

Average of 12,000 Trees Per Year

Challenges

- Tree pricing was increasing and customers were challenged with economic conditions
- 2. Current program is paper and labor intensive
 - a. Create Back-of-Bill coupon
 - b. Artwork
 - c. Postage
 - d. Collection of coupons
 - e. Counting & verifying coupons

Solutions

- 1. Increase in incentive amount due to economic conditions
 - a. Increase in incentive was approved by City Council in February 2023
- 2. The ability to manage program with a software tool created by the Arbor Day Foundation

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REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP) 2325

- 1. RFP 2325 was issued by the City Purchasing Division to identify all available software tools to support RPU's management of the Tree Power Program
 - a. Released on November 9, 2023
 - b. Closed on December 1, 2023 with only one respondent, the Arbor Day Foundation
- 2. Requirements of the RFP include:
 - a. Customer support phone number to provide support for RPU, participating nurseries and program participants
 - b. Electronic communication with program participants
 - c. Annual satisfaction survey
 - d. Access to the software tool in multiple languages
 - e. Energy savings reporting to RPU
 - f. Have the ability to issue coupons in various formats



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RFP RESULTS

- 1. The RFP closed on December 1, 2023, with one response
- 2. The Arbor Day Foundation was found to be responsive and responsible.



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RECOMMENDATIONS

That Board of Public Utilities recommend that the City Council:

- 1. Approve the Fiscal Year 2024/25 Tree Power Program Free Shade Tree Coupon Campaign in the amount of \$462,968;
- 2. Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to issue purchase orders and change orders to Parkview Nursery, 4377 Chicago Avenue; Parkview Nursery, 3841 Jackson Street; and Louie's Nursery, 18550 Van Buren Boulevard based on the variable product demand of each nursery for the Tree Power Program's Free Shade Tree Coupon campaign in a collective amount of \$462,968;
- Approve the Professional Consultant Services Agreement from Request for Proposal No. 2325 for software to administer the Tree Power Program to Arbor Day Foundation for \$525,000 with a 10% contingency of \$52,500 for a total not to exceed amount of \$577,500;
- 4. Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to execute the Professional Consultant Services Agreements, execute the optional extensions at \$175,000 annually, and including making minor and non-substantive changes to the agreements.

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
