ISSUE:

BACKGROUND:

In January 2014, photographer Kyle Cassidy attended the American Library Association (ALA) Midwinter Meeting in Philadelphia, PA, to photograph librarians and subsequently published a photo essay on Slate.com titled "This is What a Librarian Looks Like". The essay showcased a number of portraits and a tribute to librarians.

Black Dog & Leventhal published the book and released it on May 16, 2017. The book contains photographs and personal thoughts on what it means to be a librarian today from male and female librarians of all ages, ethnicities, backgrounds, and personalities. In addition to the personal stories, the book contains short essays about librarians written by famous writers, journalists and contributors.


DISCUSSION:
