

# AWARD RFB NO. 8090 TO UNIVAR SOLUTIONS USA LLC. FOR PROCUREMENT OF 12.5% SODIUM HYPOCHLORITE

#### **Water Operations**

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### **BACKGROUND**

- 1. The water operations division delivers over 27.5 billion gallons of drinking water annually.
- 2. The final step in the drinking water treatment process is the disinfection of the raw water.
- 3. State of California Division of Drinking Water requires disinfection before drinking water is delivered to customers.
- 4. Riverside uses 12.5% sodium hypochlorite.



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# **BACKGROUND CONT.**

- 5. 12.5% Sodium hypochlorite is purchased in bulk and delivered to treatment sites.
- 6. Deliveries are scheduled weekly during the summer and less often during low demand periods.
- 7. Certified treatment operators schedule and accept deliveries.
- 8. Chlorine is stored in chemical tanks and pumps inject it into the water system at treatment locations.

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#### **DISCUSSION**

- 1. RFB No. 8090 was posted on the City's Online Bid System on April 3, 2024 and closed on April 17, 2024.
- 2. Three vendors submitted proposals that met the RFB scope of services and Purchasing requirements.
- 3. Proposals were evaluated based on lowest bidder and Univar Solutions USA LLC. of Kent, WA was the low bid.

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#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

That the Riverside Public Utilities Board:

- 1. Award RFB No. 8090 to Univar Solutions USA LLC. for the procurement of 12.5% liquid sodium hypochlorite, for three years, in the annual amount of \$571,200 and,
- 2. Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute annual POs and renewals with Univar Solutions USA LLC. for such procurements, including making minor and non-substantive changes and to sign all documents and instruments necessary to complete the transactions.
