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BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES 2024 WORKPLAN

- 1. The Board of Public Utilities (BPU) adopted its workplan at its December 11, 2023 Meeting
 - a. The workplan outlined 5 topic areas with 14 detailed items to undertake for Calendar Year 2024
- 2. On January 11, 2024, the Mobility and Infrastructure Committee approved a BPU Workplan
 - a. Consolidated the BPU topic areas and items into 5 items aligned with the most relevant Strategic Priority from the City's Strategic Plan
 - Consolidated items included the detailed items approved by the BPU

- 3. On September 23, 2024, staff provided the Board with a Work Plan mid-year review
- 4. Staff and Board continue to complete the 5 (five)action items for the 2024 Workplan
