SUBJECT: PRESENTATION ON THE BROWN ACT - CALIFORNIA'S OPEN MEETING LAW

ISSUE:

That the Park and Recreation Commission receive and file a presentation from the City Attorney's Office on the Brown Act, also known as California's Open Meeting Law.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Park and Recreation Commission receive and file a presentation from the City Attorney's Office on the Brown Act, also known as California's Open Meeting Law.

BACKGROUND:

The Brown Act was enacted in 1953 and is codified in the California Government Code, section 54950, et seq. In general, the Brown Act requires the deliberations and actions of California's public agency governing boards, commissions and councils be taken openly and in public.

The City Attorney's Office has prepared a presentation to present to the Park and Recreation Commission reviewing the requirements of the Brown Act, also known as California's Open Meeting Law.

DISCUSSION:

The City Attorney's Office has requested to present to the Commission a review of the requirements of the Brown Act.

STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT:

The presentation regarding the Brown Act, also known as California's Open Meeting Law, supports the priorities of the City of Riverside's Envision Riverside 2025 Strategic Plan, by contributing to **Strategic Priority No. 5 – High Performing Government** by supporting the following:

Goal 5.3 – Enhance communication and collaboration with community members to improve transparency, build public trust, and encourage shared decision-making.

This item aligns with each of the five Cross-Cutting Threads as follows:

A presentation to the Park and Recreation Commission on the Brown Act, also known as California’s Open Meeting Law, ensures that the Commission is transparent and makes decisions based on sound policy, inclusive community engagement, involvement of City Boards and Commissions, and timely and reliable information.

3. **Fiscal Responsibility** – A presentation to the Park and Recreation Commission on the Brown Act, also known as California’s Open Meeting Law, ensures that the public is informed about how the City of Riverside is a prudent steward of public funds and ensures responsible management of the City’s financial resources while providing quality public services to all.
4. **Innovation** – A presentation to the Park and Recreation Commission on the Brown Act, also known as California’s Open Meeting Law, ensures that the public is informed about how the City of Riverside is inventive and timely in meeting the community’s changing needs and prepares for the future through collaborative partnerships and adaptive processes.
5. **Sustainability & Resiliency** – A presentation to the Park and Recreation Commission on the Brown Act, also known as California’s Open Meeting Law, ensures that the public is informed that the City Riverside is committed to meeting the needs of the present without compromising the needs of the future and ensuring the City of Riverside’s capacity to persevere, adapt and grow during good and difficult times alike.
