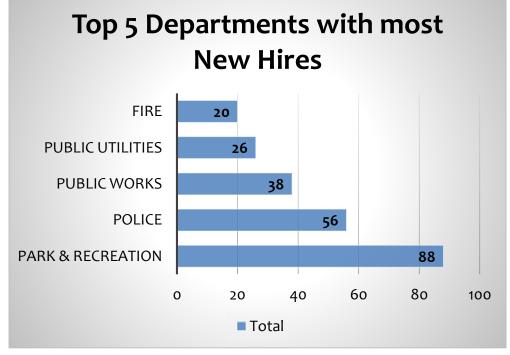

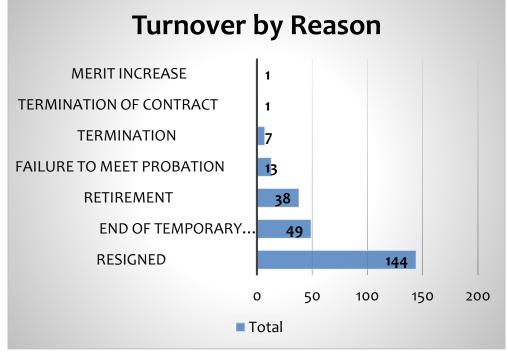

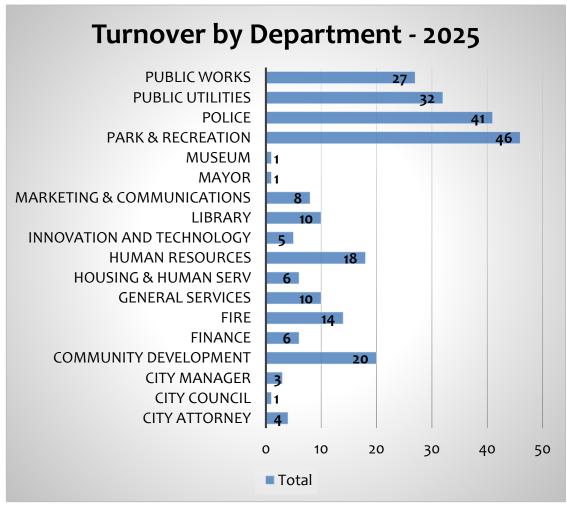

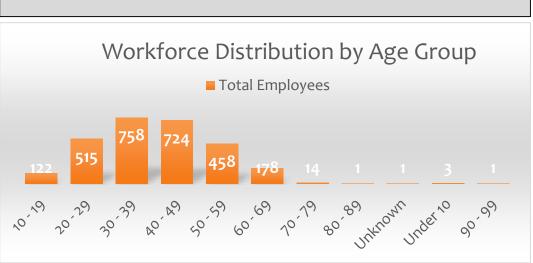
Turnover Quarterly Comparison by Reason for Leaving

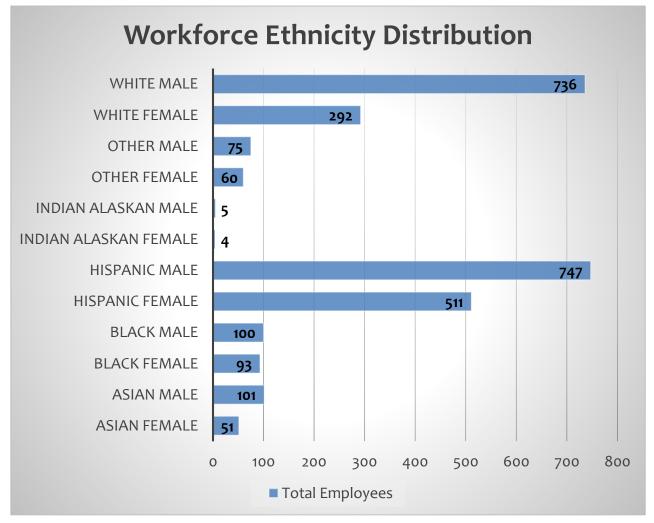

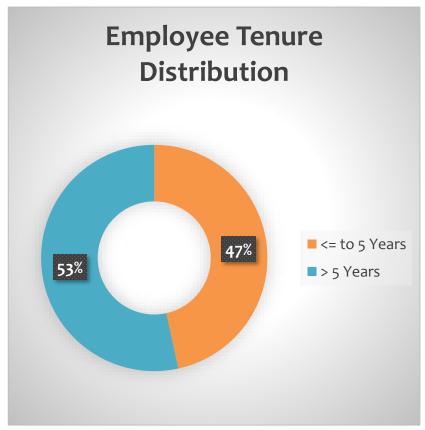


Employee Tenure

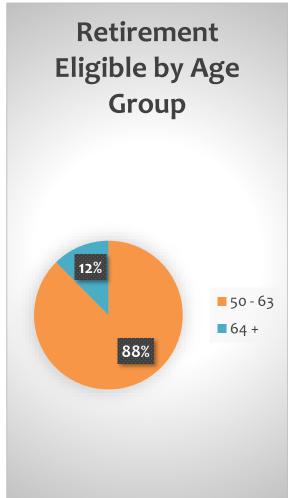


Over half of the workforce (1,482 employees) have been with the City for over 5 years!



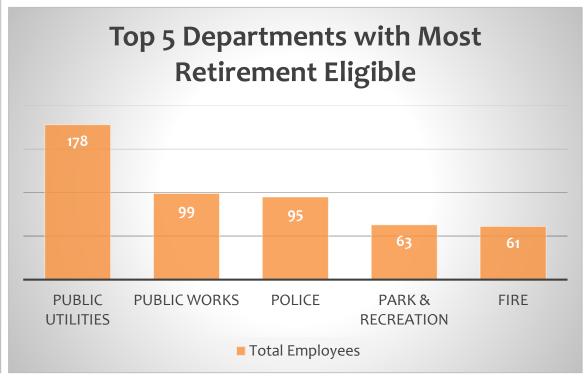


Retirement Eligible

66% of Employees (431) that are eligible for retirement have been employed with the city for 11+ Years!



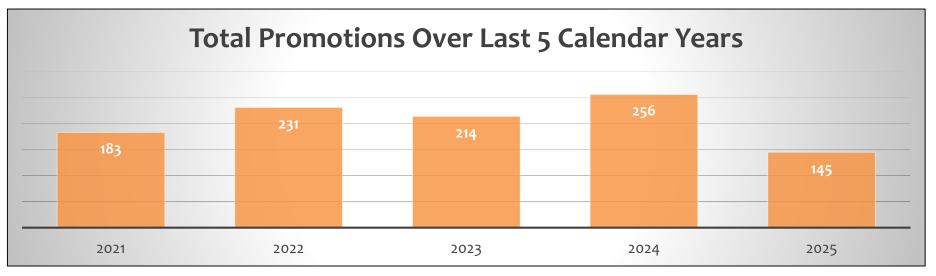

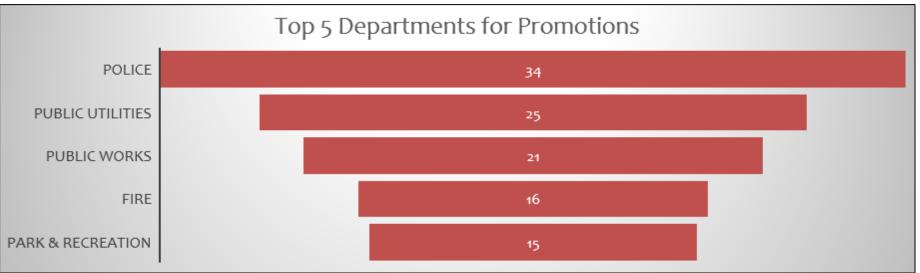
Total Promotions YTD

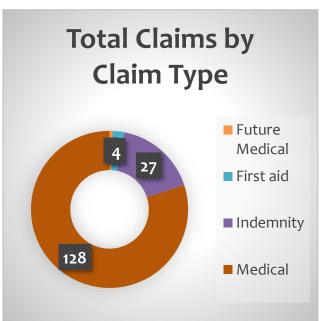

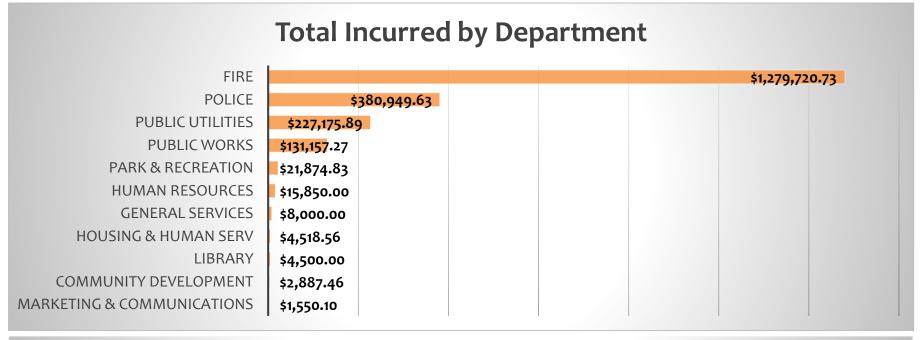

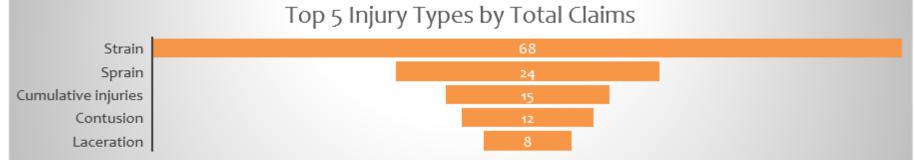
Workers' Compensation

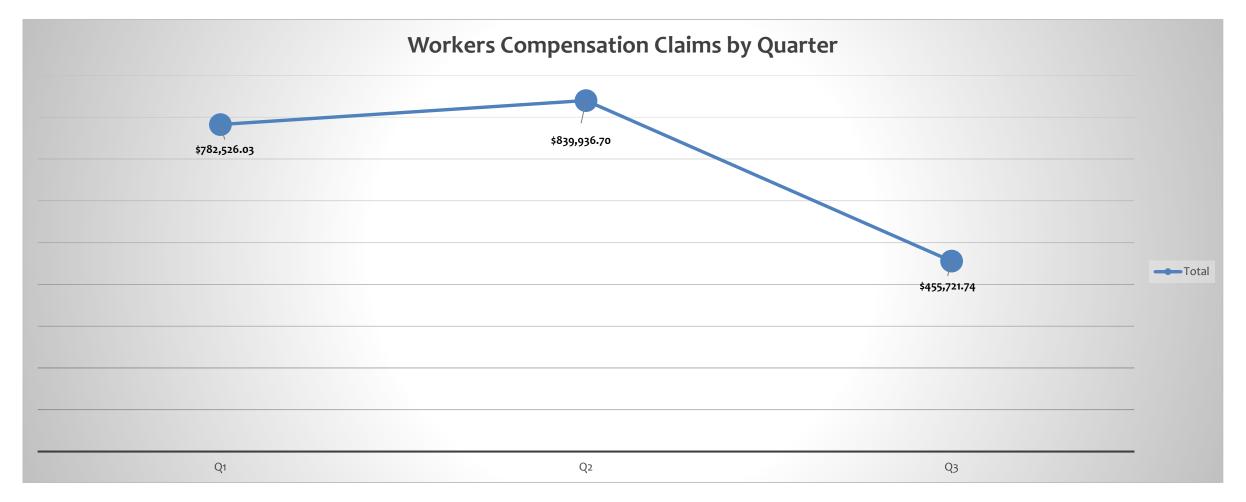

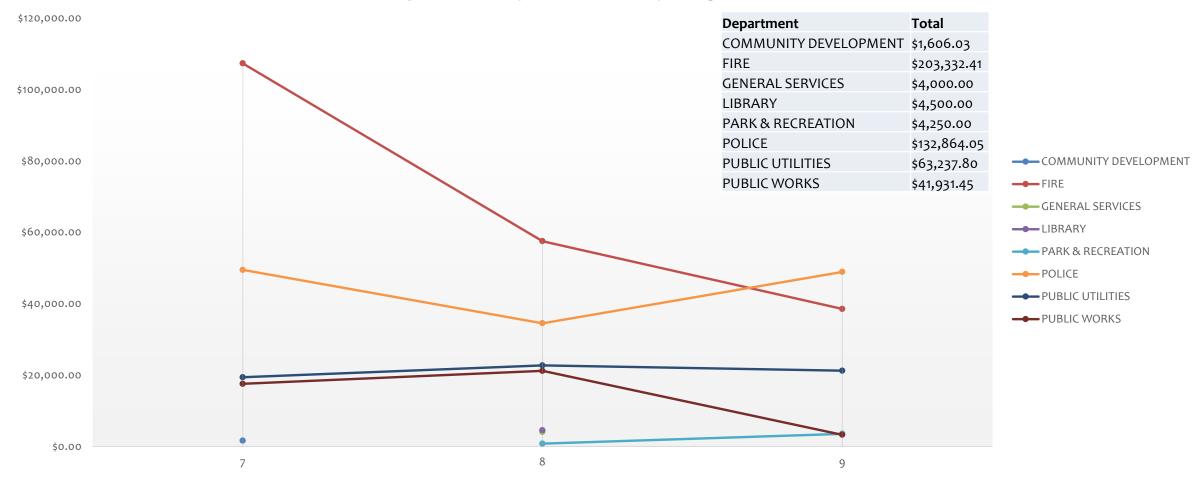

Q3 Monthly Incurred by Department

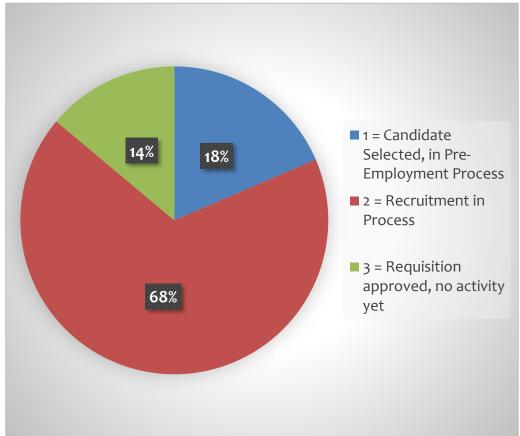


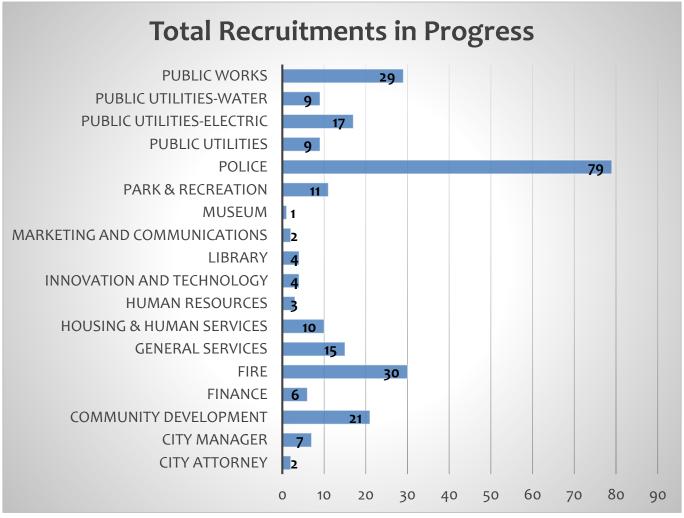

As of 9/30/2025 there were 259 total recruitments in progress across the city!





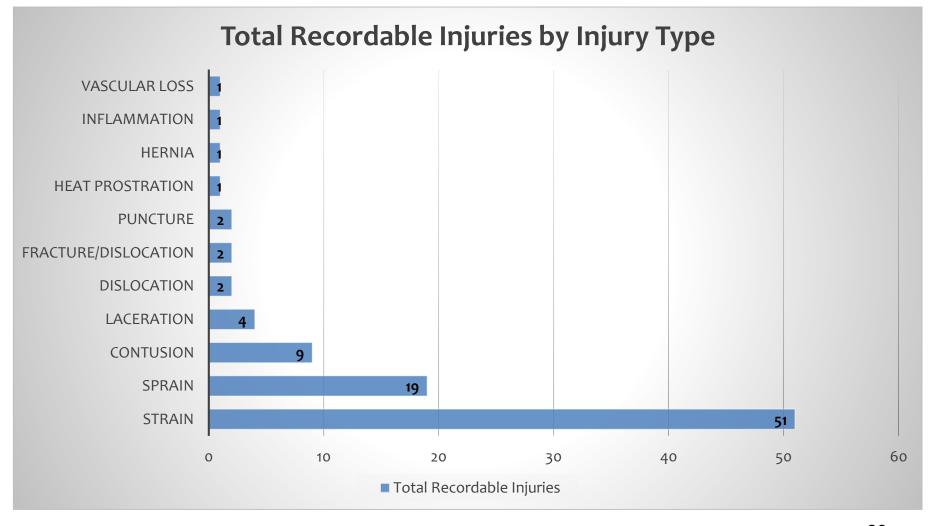

Highlighted Changes

- Total # of Employee Count: 2811 vs 2775 (-36)
- Total Appointments (hires): 210 vs 277 (+67)
- Turnover: 146 vs 253 (+107)
- **Promotions:** 100 vs 145 (+45)
- Transfers: 53 vs 164 (+111)
- Workers' Compensation Claims: 82 vs 160 (+78)
