The DUI Problem

- Prior to 1994, nearly **50%** of total traffic crashes were alcohol-related
- **10,598** alcohol-related fatalities represented **30%** of all traffic fatalities (2020)

Average DWI Violator

- Drives intoxicated 80 times before arrest
- Once every four or five nights
- Some every day

Alcohol-Related Crash Fatalities

- 26% on weekends were alcohol-impaired
- 3 times higher at night
- 1.02 million DWI arrests in 2019
- Average one fatality every 52 minutes
- Cost society approximately \$44 billion

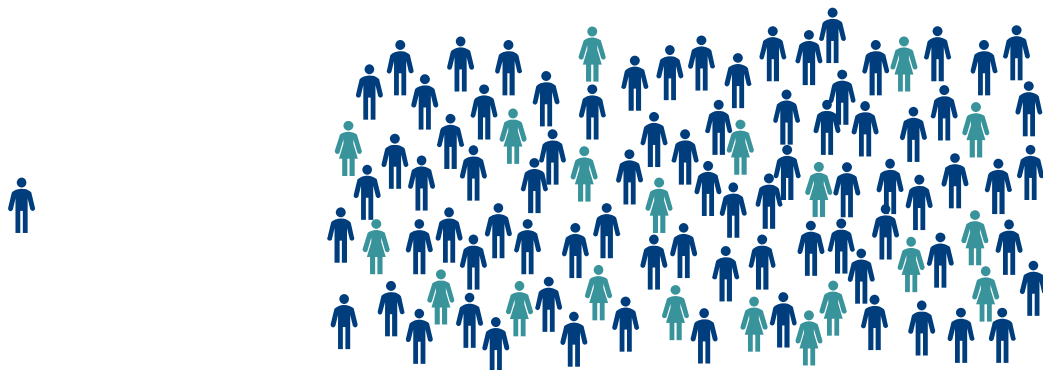


Deterrence



How Much Deterrence is Enough?

For every DWI violator arrested, there are approximately 100 undetected DWI violations.



DUI

CVC 23152(a) It is unlawful for a person who is under the influence of any alcoholic beverage to drive a vehicle.

CVC 23152(b) It is unlawful for a person who has 0.08 percent or more, by weight, of alcohol in his or her blood to drive a vehicle.

LAB Studies

- NHTSA research began in 1975 in California
- Three final reports published
 - California: 1977 (lab study only)
 - California: 1981 (lab/field study)
 - Maryland, Washington, DC, Virginia, North Carolina: 1983 (field study only)

Volunteers subjected to 6 tests

- One Leg Stand
- Finger-to-Nose
- Finger Count
- Walk and Turn
- Tracing
- Nystagmus

Standardized Tests

- Laboratory research indicated three of these tests, when administered in a standardized manner, were highly accurate and reliable tests for distinguishing blood alcohol concentrations (BACs) at or above 0.10; **HGN**, **WAT**, and **OLS**.
- The research showed these three tests were the most accurate and the remaining tests were merely reassessing the same skills.

Field Validation Studies

- Colorado(95), Florida(97), and San Diego(98)
- Trained Officers
- Standardized, practical, and effective procedures
- Determine feasibility of procedures in enforcement conditions
- Determine if tests discriminate in field as well as in laboratory

Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus

- 6 Clues total
 - Lack of Smooth Pursuit
 - Sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation
 - Onset prior to 45 degrees

• **4 out of 6 clues=**

88% Accurate

Walk and Turn

- 8 clues total
 - Balance Phase
 - Starts too soon
 - Fail to maintain balance
 - Walking phase
 - Uses arms
 - Stopping
 - Improper Turn
 - Steps offline
 - Miss heel to toe
 - Wrong number of steps

• **2 Clues out of 8 =**

79% Accurate

One Leg Stand

- 4 Clues total
 - Uses Arms
 - Puts foot down
 - Swaying
 - Hopping

• **2 out of 4 clues=**

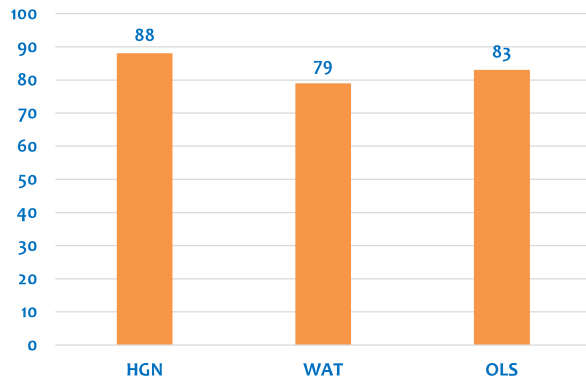
83% Accurate

San Diego Validation Study

- 91% correct-arrest decision for 0.08 BAC and above using three SFSTs
- HGN is still most reliable of three SFSTs and supports arrest decisions at 0.08 BAC

Standardized Field Sobriety Test Training

- 24 hour classroom course
- Alcohol Workshop
- Officers are taught to recognize specific scientifically validated clues of impairment.
 - Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus
 - Walk and Turn
 - One Leg Stand

City of Riverside DUI Arrests

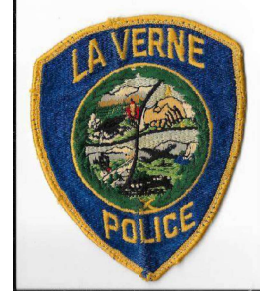
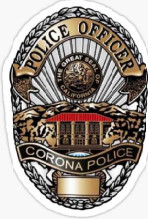

Enforcement

- Officers are trained with hands on experience through an alcohol workshop
