





## **SUBJECT:**

**Naming of City-owned Land, Buildings and Facilities**

## **PURPOSE:**

The public has expressed interest periodically in the naming of City-owned land, buildings and facilities in honor of a resident or well known personality. Therefore, it is timely to consider policy, process and guiding criteria to ensure that the culture and heritage of Riverside, as well as the function of the building or facility under consideration for naming, will be considered.

## **POLICY:**

This policy establishes formal guidelines and procedures for considering naming requests by the public for City-owned land, buildings and facilities or portions thereof.

### **Policy and Priorities**

In determining the names to be given to City-owned land, buildings and facilities, the City Council may receive recommendations from the public and related advisory bodies such as the Park and Recreation Commission and Board of Library Trustees.

### **Guidelines**

In naming public land, buildings and facilities, the City Council and its advisory bodies shall consider the following criteria:

- Incorporating "Riverside" in the name where it is important for a building or facility to be identified with the City;
- Recognizing neighborhood or geographic identification, topographic features or historical or cultural significance associated with Riverside;
- Commemorating individuals who have served the City in an exceptional manner with such honor bestowed posthumously, except in cases deemed extraordinary. The person must be an outstanding, long-time City leader or a person of national prominence or historic

interest who has supported or contributed to the development or betterment of the community;

- The request should describe specific contributions to the City and approval by next of kin to be honored.
- Commemorating individuals or organizations that have made significant land and/or monetary contribution. This can include either a deed or substantial monetary contribution, or contribution toward acquisition and/or development of the facility, typically not less than 50 percent of the value of the property or improvements; and
- Avoiding recognition of those whose contribution has been appropriately recognized in other City venues or by other means.

#### 1. Naming of Parks, Recreational Areas and Facilities

- a. A request for naming of a park, recreational area or facility shall be submitted in writing to the City Clerk for processing by the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department (PRCSD).
- b. Those submitting a naming request should show how the proposed name is consistent with this Policy. When naming after a person or persons, the application will describe the contributions to the City. Written documentation of approval by next of kin to be honored (if available/possible) is required as part of the proposal.
- c. PRCSD staff will review the proposal for adherence to the stated guidelines and authentication of statements relative to contributions in the case of an individual before forwarding to the Park and Recreation Commission.
- d. The Park and Recreation Commission will offer the opportunity for public input on the proposed naming.
- e. The Park and Recreation Commission shall forward their recommendation to name Parks, Recreational Areas and/or Facilities to the City Council for final decision.
- f. In the absence of any public naming requests, the Park and Recreation Commission shall consider names which adhere to the Policy guidelines set forth.
- g. At a minimum, each park and community buildings will be designated a name. Naming of specific areas within a park (garden, swimming pool, lake, ballfield, etc.) is acceptable but should be kept to a minimum to avoid confusion. No park shall be given a name which might be perceived as controversial by the community. All names selected shall be acceptable and meaningful to a majority of the neighborhood/community where the park or recreation facility is located.
- h. All parks shall have an entrance sign and buildings will have a plaque for name identification.

#### 2. Renaming of Parks, Recreational Areas and Facilities

Renaming of parks, recreational areas and facilities carries with it a much greater review of process compared to initial naming. Tradition and continuity of name and community identification are important community values. Each application must meet the criteria in this Policy, but meeting all criteria does not ensure renaming.

- a. A request for renaming of a park, recreational area or facility shall be submitted in writing to the City Clerk for processing by the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department (PRCSD).
- b. The request shall include the proposed name change, the purpose of the change, and how the proposed name change is consistent with this Policy. When renaming after a person or persons, the application will describe the contributions to the City. Written documentation approval by next of kin to be honored (if available/possible) is required as part of the proposal.

- c. PRCSD staff will review the proposal for adherence to the stated criteria and authentication of statements relative to contributions in the case of an individual before forwarding to the Park and Recreation Commission.
- d. The Park and Recreation Commission will offer the opportunity for public input on the proposed renaming.
- e. The Park and Recreation Commission shall forward their recommendation to rename parks, recreational areas and/or facilities to the Community Services and Youth subcommittee for review and approval to move forward to City Council for final decision.
- f. A park, recreational area or facility which has previously been named in honor of an individual will not be renamed after another individual.

### 3. Naming of Library Facilities

- a. A request for naming of a library facility shall be submitted in writing to the City Clerk for processing by the Library Department.
- b. Those submitting a naming request should show how the proposed name is consistent with this Policy. When naming after a person or persons, the application will describe the contributions to the City. Written documentation of approval by next of kin to be honored (if available/possible) is required as part of the proposal.
- c. Library Department staff will review the proposal for adherence to the stated criteria and authentication of statements relative to contributions in the case of an individual before forwarding to the Board of Library Trustees.
- d. The Board of Library Trustees will offer the opportunity for public input on the proposed naming.
- e. The Board of Library Trustees shall forward their recommendation to name library facilities to the City Council for final decision.
- f. In the absence of any public naming requests, the Board of Library Trustees shall consider names which adhere to the Policy guidelines set forth.
- g. All libraries shall have an entrance sign and plaque with the designated name located on the building following approval of the formal name.

### 4. Renaming of Library Facilities

Renaming of library facilities carries with it a much greater review of process compared to initial naming. Tradition and continuity of name and community identification are important community values. Each application must meet the criteria in this Policy, but meeting all criteria does not ensure renaming.

- a. A request for renaming of a library facility shall be submitted in writing to the City Clerk for processing by the Library Department.
- b. The request shall include the proposed name change, the purpose of the change and how the proposed name change is consistent with this Policy. When renaming after a person or persons, the application will describe the contributions to the City. Written documentation approval by next of kin to be honored (if available/possible) is required as part of the proposal.
- c. Library Department staff will review the proposal for adherence to the stated criteria and authentication of statements relative to contributions in the case of an individual before forwarding to the Board of Library Trustees.
- d. The Board of Library Trustees will offer the opportunity for public input on the proposed renaming.
- e. The Board of Library Trustees shall forward their recommendation to rename library facilities to the City Council for final decision.

**5. Naming/Renaming of City Land, Buildings and Facilities (Non-Park, Recreational or Library)**

- a. A request for naming/renaming of City land, buildings or facilities shall be submitted in writing to the City Clerk for processing by the City Manager's Office.
- b. Those submitting a naming/renaming request should show how the proposed name is consistent with this Policy. When naming after a person or persons, the application will describe the contributions to the City. Written documentation of approval by next of kin to be honored (if available/possible) is required as part of the proposal.
- c. City staff will review the proposal for adherence to the stated criteria and authentication of statements relative to contributions in the case of an individual before forwarding to the City Manager.
- d. The City Manager may assign the request for naming/renaming of non-park, recreational or library to a review board or committee for community input and review.
- e. The City Manager shall forward any recommendation to name/rename City-owned land, buildings and facilities to the City Council for final decision.

Public requests for naming of City-owned land, buildings and facilities may be submitted to the City Clerk's Office or Department having jurisdiction in writing, accompanied by a justification for the recommended name(s). All requests will be referred to the appropriate Board(s) or Commission(s) for deliberation. The related advisory bodies will evaluate the recommended name within six months following receipt of a request with their recommendation forwarded to the City Council for consideration.

The City Council will make its determination as to the naming or renaming of City-owned land, buildings and facilities at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Council at which representatives of advisory bodies and civic organizations and the general public may offer testimony.

**Recognition**

Naming may be recognized by the installation of a plaque or appropriate signage, installation of a marker or artwork as appropriate for the subject public land, building and/or facility. Manner of recognition will be determined by the advisory body and conveyed as part of their naming recommendation to the City Council.

**PROCEDURE:**

**Responsibility**

**Action**

Requesting Individual or Group:	Completes form and submits request for naming/renaming of City owned land, buildings or facility to appropriate City agency per policy guidelines.
City Clerk Staff:	Receives naming/renaming request and forwards to appropriate Department for processing.
Department Staff:	Reviews request for completeness and accuracy and adherence to policy guidelines. Refers completed naming/renaming request to appropriate Commission(s) or Board(s) for review.

**Commission/Review Body:**

**Reviews application and receives community input, as appropriate, per policy guidelines. If a recommendation is made to name/rename a facility, that recommendation shall be forwarded to the City Council for final approval. The Commission/Review Body may, however, choose not to move a request forward.**

SUBJECT: PARK NAMING ORDINANCE

Background:

At its October 11, 1994, City Council meeting Resolution No. 18250 (Attachment 1) was amended to Resolution 1858 (Attachment 2) established for the naming of park and recreation facilities.

In December 1994, the Parks Subcommittee recommended to the Park and Recreation Commission to further amend Resolution No. 18582 as indicated on Attachment 3.

Attachment 3 is a proposed revision of Resolution No 18582 which was approved by the City Council in October of 1994. The proposal by the Commission would change the resolution to restrict the naming of parks after persons who have made a significant personal financial contribution, to those persons who have made a significant personal contribution, deleting the word "financial".


Alternative:

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, as follows:

Section 1: Section 2 of Resolution No. 14159, as amended by Resolutions Nos. 18250 and 18582, is hereby further amended as follows:

"2. A park or recreation facility can be named for a person only in limited situations. Such person, except for cases deemed extraordinary by the Park and Recreation Commission, should be honored posthumously. The person for whom a park or recreation facility is named must be an outstanding, long-time City leader or a person of national prominence or historic interest who has supported or contributed to open space and/or recreation activities and concepts, or a person who has made a significant personal contribution toward the acquisition and/or development of a specific park or recreation facility. A donor whose contribution represents a major portion of a planned park or recreation facility may designate a name as a condition of the donation, providing it conforms to the naming criteria set forth above."





ZONING CASE CU-018-623 (REV.) - 6460 AND 6476 STREETER

The City Council upheld the City Planning Commission's action in approving subject to conditions the request of International Church of Foursquare Gospel (New Jerusalem Foursquare Church) for a revised conditional use permit to add a .35-acre parcel developed with a single-family residence proposed for office use and to establish an elementary school for up to 120 students on approximately 2.8 acres of land developed with a church and caretaker's residence at 6460 and 6476 Streeter Avenue, situated at the northeast corner of Streeter Avenue and Beatty Drive, in Zone R-1-65; upheld the Commission's determination that the proposal would not have a significant adverse effect on the environment; and concurred in the adoption of the Negative Declaration.

ZONING CASE CU-011-945 - 6296 RIVER CREST

The City Council upheld the City Planning Commission's action in approving subject to conditions the request of St. Patrick's Catholic Church for a conditional use permit to establish a church in an approximately 8,300-square-foot suite within an existing multi-tenant industrial office complex at 6296 River Crest Drive, situated at the southeast corner of River Crest Drive and Fischer Road easterly of the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad right-of-way, in Zones MP-BP; upheld the Commission's determination that the proposal would not have a significant adverse effect on the environment; and concurred in the adoption of the Negative Declaration.

**CASE IN-001-945 - OUTDOOR SALE OF NURSERY PLANTS AND SUPPLIES**  
 The City Council considered the City Planning Commission's action relative to the request of Wal-Mart Stores, Inc., for an interpretation of the Municipal Code to determine if the outdoor sale of nursery plants and supplies in conjunction with a larger retail operation and outside the confines of defined "garden shop" is a permitted use in Zone C-2; and upheld the Commission's interpretation as follows: "The sale of nursery plants and related materials must be located within a defined, approved and physically enclosed area. In the case of a nursery or garden shop that is incidental to a larger retail use, the area also needs to be adjacent to the primary building or at least have a direct physical relationship to the building. These uses would not be permitted to sell materials within designated parking and walkway areas except with a TUP (Temporary Use Permit). The enclosure may include a combination of solid walls and open work fencing which effectively screens the plants and nursery supplies from the surrounding area subject to the review and approval of the Design Review Board (or staff, when appropriate)."

**ZONING CASE PD-002-912 (REV.) - TRAUTWEIN AND MISSION VILLAGE**  
 The City Council upheld the City Planning Commission's action in approving the request of Van Daele Development Corp. for proposed modifications of conditions for a planned residential development to allow patio cover encroachments up to five feet from rear property line for 86 units on approximately 11.8 acres of land situated at the southeast corner of Trautwein Road and Mission Village Drive in Zone R-3-40.

**CITY MANAGER**

**JOINT PUBLIC HEARING SCHEDULED WITH REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY**  
 The City Council scheduled a joint public hearing with the Redevelopment Agency at 2 p.m. on November 1, 1994, to consider a Disposition and Maintenance Agreement between David L. Avila and the Redevelopment Agency involving the sale of an Agency-owned house at 7606 Freda Street, located in the Casa Blanca Redevelopment Project area.

**CUL-DE-SACS AT LOMA VISTA AND LOU ELLA - FUND TRANSFER**  
 The City Council approved the programming of \$25,600 from Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Contingency Account 220-511200-453001 and \$25,600 from Eastside Street Account 220-511200-440120-12015 to Greenstein Project Account 220-511200-440120-12070 for the design, engineering and construction of fully improved cul-de-sacs at Loma Vista Street and Lou Ella Lane.

**SHOWMOBILE SUBSIDY RE SHELTER FOR THE HOMELESS - REF. TO COMM.**  
 The request of Shelter for the Homeless for subsidy by the City for use of the Showmobile was referred to the City Council Finance Committee for review and recommendation to the full City Council.

**DONATION FOR GUN HOLSTERS - FUND APPROPRIATION**

The City Council accepted the donation of \$1,000 from Loma Linda University Medical Center as Miscellaneous Police Revenue Account 101-0-341190 and appropriated the \$1,000 to Police Special Departmental Supplies Account 101-231100-426800 to help defray the cost of replacement gun holsters for the Police Department.

**DISTRIBUTION LINE DESIGN/CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT SERVICES**

The City Council (1) approved the award of a contract to ESC (Electrical Systems Consultant) in an amount not to exceed \$425,000 for distribution design, construction management and related work for distribution lines including 4kv to 12kv conversions; and (2) authorized the City Manager or his designee to execute the Agreement for Consulting Services for Engineering Design and Construction Management for Distribution Projects.

**POLE ATTACHMENT AND CONDUIT LICENSE AGREEMENT WITH PACIFIC LIGHTWAVE, INC.**

The City Council (1) approved the Pole Attachment and Conduit License Agreement with Pacific Lightwave, Inc., for space rental on City-owned poles and conduits; and (2) authorized the City Manager or his designee to execute the Agreement. (See Page 80-117.)

**NOVEMBER UTILITY BILL STUFFER RE NON-STORM WATER DISCHARGES**

The City Council approved the inclusion with the November utility bills of the utility bill insert, attached to the written staff report, regarding the adverse impacts of non-storm water discharges on receiving waters.

**SUPPORT FOR RCC MARCHING BAND - REFERRED TO COMMITTEE**

At the recommendation of Mayor Loveridge, the City Council referred the request of Director Gary Locke of the Riverside Community College (RCC) Marching Band for a City contribution of \$5,000 to the Marching Band to attend the Bands of America Grand National Championship in Indianapolis at the Hoosierdome on November 4 and 5, 1994, to the City Council Finance Committee for a report to the full City Council as soon as possible.

**NAMING OF PARK AND RECREATION FACILITIES - RESOL. AMENDMENT**

**PROPOSED VACATION OF PEDESTRIAN WALKWAY BETWEEN CHEYENNE AND ANNA - FUND TRANSFER**

The City Council approved the recommendation of the City Council Finance Committee and appropriated \$1,144 from General Fund Contingency Reserve Account 101-129800-451000 to cover the filing fee for the proposed vacation of the pedestrian walkway situated between Cheyenne Road and Anna Street.

**YOUTH MOCK TRIAL PROGRAM - APPROPRIATION**

The City Council approved the recommendations of the City Council Finance Committee and (1) appropriated \$2,700 from General Fund Contingency Reserve Account 101-129800-451000 to Mock Trial Program Account 101-111300-450312; and (2) authorized the City to be listed as a sponsor of the Mock Trial Program.







FORMALIZATION OF PARK AND RECREATION NAMES

A written report was submitted from Chairman Reed of the Park and Recreation Commission, advising that on August 26, 1980, the City Council adopted a resolution establishing a policy for the naming of parks and recreation facilities, which policy states that the Commission shall be responsible for the selection of names according to certain criteria, subject to approval of the City Council; further advising that the Commission has reviewed the formal and informal names of all park and recreation facilities, and no changes are recommended for those facilities that have been formally named; and recommending that the City Council formalize the names for the facilities as listed on the attachment to the report. The recommendation was approved.

RESOLUTION NO. 14159

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING A POLICY FOR THE NAMING OF PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES BY ADOPTING BY REFERENCE CITY OF RIVERSIDE PARK AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT ADMINISTRATIVE MANUAL NO. 34 ATTACHED HERETO.

WHEREAS it is appropriate to establish a uniform policy and procedure for the naming of parks and recreation facilities

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Riverside as follows:

1. In the naming of parks and recreation facilities of the City of Riverside, preference will be given to names relating to geographical location, historical significance or geologic features.
2. No park or recreation facility shall be named for a person, except where an individual has made a significant financial contribution toward the acquisition and/or development of said park or facility, or has been an outstanding long-time community leader who has supported open space and recreational activities; and provided, that such person, except in extraordinary cases, should be honored posthumously. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, a name designated by a donor as a condition to the donation shall be acceptable if the contribution represents a major portion of the planned park or facility.
3. The Park and Recreation Commission shall be responsible for the selection of names for parks and recreation facilities, subject to the approval of the City Council.
4. All parks and recreation facilities will be designated by a formal name within six months of

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acquisition or construction; and all parks shall have an entrance sign and buildings will have a plaque with the designated name.

5. The name of a park or recreation facility may be changed only after a public hearing thereon held the Park and Recreation Commission indicating significant justification and support by the community for such change, and ratification by the City Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that City of Riverside Park and Recreation Department Administrative Manual No. 34, attached hereto, is hereby adopted and incorporated as though fully set forth herein.

Subject: NAMING PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES

Applicable City Parks and Recreation Facilities  
To:

- I. PURPOSE: To establish a uniform policy and procedure that identifies criteria for the naming of parks and recreation facilities.
- II. POLICY: The Park and Recreation Commission will be responsible for the selection of names for parks and recreation facilities. Once a name is selected it will be forwarded to the City Council for ratification. Staff will be responsible for encouraging citizens and community organizations to suggest possible names that will then be forwarded to the Commission for consideration.

At a minimum, each park and community building will be designated a name. Naming of specific areas within a park (garden, swimming pool, lake, ballfield, etc.) is acceptable but should be kept to a minimum to avoid confusion. No park shall be given a name which might be perceived as controversial by the community. All names selected shall be acceptable and meaningful to a majority of the neighborhood/community where the park or recreation facility is located.

Priority in naming sites shall be given to geographical locations, historic significance or geologic features. No park shall be named for a person, except where an individual has made a significant financial contribution toward the acquisition and/or development of the park or facility, or has been an outstanding long-time community leader who has supported open space and recreational activities. In most cases, the person should be honored posthumously. However, a donor that stipulates a name as being a requirement of the donation is acceptable if the contribution represents a major portion of the planned park or facility.

All parks and recreation facilities will be designated a formal name within six months of acquisition or construction. All parks shall have an entrance sign and buildings will have a plaque for name identification.

The name of a park or recreation facility may be changed only after a public hearing is held by the Commission to receive community input and direction. No name shall be changed unless there is significant justification and support by the community.
