SUBJECT: MEASURE Z – PURCHASE OF FIVE (5) REPLACEMENT BMW POLICE MOTORCYCLES FROM RIDE ON POWERSPORTS DBA BMW MOTORCYCLES OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA IN ACCORDANCE WITH PURCHASING RESOLUTION 23256, SECTION 602(G) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$150,114.25

**ISSUE:**

Approve the purchase of five replacement BMW Police Motorcycles from Ride On Powersports, dba BMW Motorcycles of Riverside, California, in accordance with Purchasing Resolution 23256, Section 602(g) in the amount of \$150,114.25.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

That the City Council approve the purchase of five replacement BMW Police Motorcycles from Ride On Powersports, dba BMW Motorcycles of Riverside, California, in accordance with Purchasing Resolution 23256 in the amount of \$150,114.25.

**BACKGROUND:**

To help address service cuts and a portion of the City’s critical unfunded needs, at staff’s recommendation, the Mayor and the City Council placed Measure Z on the November 8, 2016 ballot. The measure authorized a one-cent increase in the City’s sales tax rate and was approved by over 60% of Riverside voters. Collection of the additional one-cent sales tax authorized by voters through Measure Z began on April 1, 2017.

After hearing recommended Measure Z spending options from City staff and the Budget Engagement Committee, on May 16, 2017 the City Council approved the Measure Z Spending Plan, which appropriated \$9.5 million in Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-2017 and \$20.5 million in FY 2017-2018. As part of the Measure Z Spending Plan, the City Council approved funding for a five-year Vehicle Replacement and Maintenance Plan.

On January 23, 2018, the City Council awarded Bid No. 7516 to Ride On Powersports, dba BMW Motorcycles of Riverside, California (BMW), for the purchase of five BMW R12000RTP Police Motorcycles in the amount of \$150,114.25. BMW has agreed to provide five additional Police motorcycles to the City at the same cost per unit, \$30,022.85 per unit, as awarded in Bid No. 7516 to replace motorcycles that are out of service.

The General Services Department would like to purchase five additional Police motorcycles from BMW in the amount of \$150,114.25 in accordance with Purchasing Resolution 23256, Section

602(g) which states that competitive procurement through the informal procurement and formal procurement process shall not be required when goods can be procured from a bidder who offers the same or better price, terms and conditions as the bidder previously offered as the lowest responsive bidder under competitive procurement provided that, in the opinion of the Manager, it is in the best interests of the City to do so.

**DISCUSSION:**

The Fleet Division evaluates all vehicle replacement criteria to ensure the efficient management and replacement of vehicles. The Police motorcycles being replaced have exceeded their expected service life and require extensive repairs to be made serviceable as outlined in the table below:

These vehicles meet the requirements of South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) Rule 1191 (clean on-road light-and medium-duty public fleet vehicles) which requires that public fleets acquire alternative-fuel vehicles to reduce pollutant emissions.

The Purchasing Manager concurs that the recommendation is in compliance with the current Purchasing Resolution 23256, and the Chief of Police concurs with the recommendation above.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

The total fiscal impact of the action is \$150,114.25. Sufficient funds are available in the FY 2018-19 Measure Z Vehicle Replacement Account No. 3115009-450057.
