#### ESTABLISHMENT OF A 2022 COMMUNITY OUTREACH AD HOC COMMITTEE



#### BRIEF REPORTS ON CONFERENCES, SEMINARS, AND MEETINGS ATTENDED BY CPRC


Commissioners reported on the various meetings, training sessions and outreach of which they recently attended/participated.

#### UPDATES FROM THE RIVERSIDE POLICE DEPARTMENT

Captain Payne reported a RPD Sr. Background Investigator will be present at the May 2022 CPRC Meeting to give a presentation regarding the RPD background process. He also reported the RPD Chief recently gave a presentation to both the Safety, Wellness and Youth Committee and the City Council on the new Military Equipment Use Policy, created under AB Bill 481. The Chief will give a presentation on the new policy at the May 2022 CPRC Meeting.

CPRC Manager Megan Stoye gave an update to the Commission regarding the status of the Sr. Administrative Assistant recruitment to fill the CPRC Secretary vacancy. Engagement Commission (BEC) and City Council. An update will be given to CPRC once the PSET Expansion is finalized.

The following City Council items associated with RPD were also reported:

March 15, 2022:

- (1) Acceptance of a State of California traffic Safety Selective Traffic Enforcement grant in the amount of \$437,341.66 for overtime operations including bicycle and pedestrian enforcements, distracted driving operations, traffic enforcement operations, motorcycle safety, and DUI saturation patrols and checkpoints from October 1, 2022 through September 20, 2023.
- (2) Memorandum of Understanding with Riverside County Probation Department and Post-Release Accountability and Compliance Team for Public Safety Realignment reimbursement of \$270,000 for personnel costs through June 30, 2022.
- (3) Appropriation of \$533,475 to Grants and Special Programs Fund for overtime and maintenance reimbursement in various local, state, and federal task forces.

March 22, 2022:

- (1) Issuance of a Purchase Order with Proforce Law Enforcement in the amount of \$133,861.47 for the purchase of 100 X26P Tasers, batteries and holsters.
- (2) First Amendment to Agreement with H.E.R.O.S., Inc. for \$21,418.54 increased compensation for overhaul of one Police Department helicopter Gearbox and Turbine.

April 5, 2022:


- (1) Issuance of a Purchase Order with Lehr in the amount of \$247,323.50 for the purchase of 40 panasonic toughbooks with accessories and warranties.

April 12, 2022:

- (1) Issuance of a Purchase Order with Hangar One Avionics in the amount of \$423,796.57 for the purchase of a refurbished Forward-Looking InfraRed (FLIR) camera for the Police Aviation Unit.

April 19, 2022:

- (1) Approval of a Purchase and Sale Agreement with the County of Riverside for the Downtown Police Headquarters located at 4102 Orange Street.

- (2) Resolution approving the acceptance of the California Highway Patrol's 2022/23 Cannabis Tax Fund Grant Program Award in the amount of \$111,003.46 for education, prevention, and enforcement of laws related to driving under the influence.

April 26, 2022:

- (1) Introduction of an Ordinance adding Chapter 2.70 to the Riverside Municipal Code regarding the adoption of Military Equipment Use Policy pursuant to California Assembly Bill 481 and California Government Code Section 7070.

- (1) Commissioner Payne requested RPD make a presentation to CPRC regarding PSET and the current RPD social media policy pertaining to arrested/detained individuals.
- (2) Commissioner DeBrier requested an update from RPD regarding the current status of Officer Involved Deaths (OID) and requested an update be given regarding previously requested presentation materials for use by the CPRC Outreach Committee.
- (3) Commissioner Raya requested a presentation regarding the communication tools RPD currently uses to interact with the ASL Community in Riverside.
- (4) Chair Teichert requested an attachment to future agenda and/or materials to track pending requests made by Commissioners.
- (5) Commissioner Hiraes requested guidance in order to make a presentation to the City Council to request funding for more iPads for RPD use while interacting with the ASL community.
