SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL NO. 2291 - MASTER PROFESSIONAL CONSULTANT SERVICES AGREEMENTS WITH EIGHTEEN (18) CONSULTING FIRMS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SIX (6) REAL PROPERTY SERVICES CONSULTANT PANELS CONSISTING OF APPRAISAL, ACQUISITION, RELOCATION, PROPERTY MANAGEMENT, ENVIRONMENTAL, AND SECURITY GUARD SERVICES FOR FUTURE CITY PROJECTS FOR AN INITIAL TERM OF FIVE YEARS WITH THREE OPTIONAL ONE-YEAR EXTENSIONS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$250,000 FOR EACH AGREEMENT

ISSUE:

Approve Request for Proposal No. 2291 - Master Professional Consultant Services Agreements with eighteen (18) consulting firms for the establishment of six (6) Real Property Services consultant panels consisting of Appraisal, Acquisition, Relocation, Property Management, Environmental, and Security Guard services for future City projects for an initial term of five years with three optional one-year extensions in an amount not to exceed \$250,000 for each agreement.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the City Council:

1. Approve twenty-four (24) Master Professional Consultant Services Agreements with eighteen (18) consulting firms for the establishment of six (6) Real Property Services Consultant Panels with the attached list of consultants (Attachment 1 – List of Consultants) for future City projects for an initial term of five years with three optional one-year extensions in an amount not to exceed \$250,000 for each agreement;
2. Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Master Professional Consultant Services Agreements with various consulting firms, including making minor non-substantive changes, and any extensions thereto in substantial conformance with the attached Master Professional Consultant Services Agreements; and
3. Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute all supplemental agreements and/or purchase orders for the Master Professional Consultant Services Agreements.

BACKGROUND:

On April 6, 2010, the City Council and the Housing Authority Board authorized the creation of Real Property Services Consultant Panels and approved Master Professional Consultant Services Agreements with various consultants. These agreements provided appraisal, acquisition, relocation, environmental, and property management services for the City of Riverside (City) and the Housing Authority projects.

Subsequently, on December 18, 2018, the City Council and the Housing Authority Board again authorized the Real Property Services Consultant Panels and approved new Master Professional Consultant Services Agreements. This updated panel expanded the scope of services to include security guard services with appraisal, acquisition, relocation, environmental, and property management services. These agreements were set to expire on December 31, 2023.

To maintain continuity of services, the City later entered into First Amendment agreements, extending the term to December 31, 2024. Additionally, select consultants received another extension to continue providing services through 2025.

DISCUSSION:

The purpose of the consultant panel is to prequalify consultants for conducting appraisals, acquisition, relocation, environmental, security guard, and property management services on an as-needed basis, eliminating the need to review the consultants' qualifications for each project. Upon receipt of a "Work Request" form from a client department to Real Property Services, a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the specific scope of work will be issued to the appropriate consultant panel. Proposals are received, and the best consultant is selected from the panel for the assignment based on cost and the time required to complete the task.

Request for Proposal (RFP) No. 2291 was issued on January 9, 2024, to establish the new consultant panel for the six specialty areas: appraisal, acquisition, relocation, environmental, security guard, and property management. A six-member RFP review panel, with a representative from the Housing Authority, Public Utilities, the City Manager's office, and Real Property Services, assessed each proposal received for completeness, minimum qualifications, appropriate licenses and insurance, sufficient experience, staff, and fees. The assessment resulted in 19 qualified consultant firms, many of which qualified for more than one panel. However, 1 firm failed to execute and return their agreement, resulting in a total of 24 agreements for approval, as detailed below (Attachments 2 through 25):

FISCAL IMPACT:

The total compensation for each Master Professional Consultant Services Agreement shall not exceed an aggregate amount of \$250,000 over the initial five-year term plus the three optional one-year extensions, not to exceed \$50,000 annually, if exercised, regardless of which agency requests the work.

Costs associated with these agreements will be on a project-by-project basis funded by various departments. Funding for the services provided by the consultants will be included in each department's respective budget for the various projects that require these services from the Real Property Services Division.
