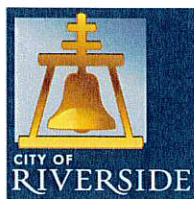
HISPANIC HEARITAGE MONTH

Seventy-seven people spoke on the matter.

The Mayor and City Council recessed at 8:21 p.m. and reconvened at 8:30 p.m. with Mayor Lock Dawson and all Councilmembers present.

Following discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Cervantes and seconded by Councilmember Mill to adopt the revised version of the resolution affirming the importance of transparency, community and public safety, and clear identification standards in federal immigration enforcement activities in the City of Riverside. The motion carried with Councilmembers Falcone, Cervantes, Mill and Hemenway voting aye and Councilmembers Robillard, Conder and Perry voting no.

Whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 24310 of the City Council of the City of Riverside Affirming the Importance of Transparency, Community Safety, Public Safety, and Clear Identification Standards in Federal Immigration Enforcement Activities in the City of Riverside, was presented and adopted.

The Mayor and City Council recessed at 8:59 p.m. and reconvened at 9:03 p.m. with Mayor Lock Dawson and all Councilmembers present.
