



1 The Board of the Museum of Riverside shall have the powers, duties and functions to serve in an  
2 advisory capacity to the City Council in matters pertaining to the museum sites, scope, growth and  
3 development, care, maintenance, daily operations and activities. They shall:

- 4 A. Act in the spirit of the museum's mission to advise on the stewardship of the museum's  
5 cultural resources for the benefit of the public;
- 6 B. Make recommendations regarding the scope of the museum activities;
- 7 C. Review the annual budget for personnel and operational needs of the museum during the  
8 process of its preparation and make recommendations with respect thereto to the City Council  
9 and the City Manager;
- 10 D. Review specific collection and exhibition goals and policies for the museum and provide  
11 guidance;
- 12 E. Make recommendations regarding the acceptance or rejection of all proposed gifts of money,  
13 specifically designated for museum purposes, as follows: acceptance of monetary donations  
14 valued at \$2,500 or below may be approved by the Museum Director; acceptance of monetary  
15 donations valued more than \$2,500 and up to \$25,000 may be approved by the City Chief  
16 Financial Officer/City Treasurer; monetary donations valued more than \$25,000 must be  
17 approved by City Council upon recommendation of the Board;
- 18 F. Approve or decline the accession of gifts of specimens and artifacts for museum's permanent  
19 collection on behalf of the City, with periodic ratification of such acceptance by the City  
20 Council;
- 21 G. Approve or decline deaccessions of museum objects from the permanent collection in  
22 accordance with needs of the museum and consistent with general provisions of the Charter;
- 23 H. Make recommendations to the City Council regarding contracts with Riverside County, local  
24 school districts and/or other agencies for museum services;
- 25 I. Make recommendations regarding membership or support groups dedicated to the museum;
- 26 J. Initiate any other recommendations to the City Council and City Manager concerning the  
development, care, maintenance, operation and welfare of the Museum of Riverside, and  
make recommendations on such other museum matters as the City Council or City Manager  
may request;
- K. Perform such other advisory functions relating to museum activities as may be desired by the  
City Council."

1                    Section 5: Section 2.12.040 of the Riverside Municipal Code entitled “Title to Property” is  
2  
3 hereby amended as follows:

4                    “2.12.040 - Title to property.

5 The title to all real and personal property acquired and utilized by the Museum of Riverside or any of  
6 its branches, when not otherwise designated by terms of its acquisition, shall vest in the City.”

7                    Section 6: Section 2.12.050 of the Riverside Municipal Code entitled “Special fund created”  
8 is hereby amended as follows:

9                    “2.12.050 - Special fund created.

10 There is hereby created a special fund of the City, to be known as the "Museum Fund." Revenues  
11 derived from any allowable special fees, from the sale of inappropriate artifacts, or from any real  
12 property held in the name of the Museum of Riverside Board, together with all moneys acquired  
13 through gift, bequest or otherwise which have been specifically designated for museum purposes, shall  
be deposited in the City Treasury to the credit of such fund. They shall be kept separate and apart from  
all other moneys of the City, and shall be devoted exclusively to museum purposes.”

14                    Section 7: The City Council has reviewed the matter and, based upon the facts and information  
15 contained in the staff reports, administrative record, and written and oral testimony, hereby finds that  
16 this ordinance is not subject to CEQA pursuant to Sections 15060(c)(2), 15060(c)(3) and/or  
17 15061(b)(3) of the State CEQA Guidelines, California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, in  
18 that it will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment  
19 nor have a significant impact on the environment.  
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21                    Section 8: The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and cause publication  
22 once in a newspaper of general circulation in accordance with Section 414 of the Charter of the City  
23 of Riverside. This ordinance shall become effective on the 30th day after the date of its adoption.
