Chair Moran called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion was made by Member Soza and seconded by Vice Chair Armas approving the February 6, 2019, Transportation Board meeting minutes as presented.

Motion carried unanimously. Member Sheth and Ayala abstained.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE

DISCUSSION CALENDAR

ALLEY BETWEEN MISSION INN AND UNIVERSITY AVENUES AND ORANGE STREET AND THE MAIN STREET PEDESTRIAN MALL – CONVERSION OF PORTION TO ONE-WAY TRAVEL

Following discussion motion was made by Member Sheth and seconded by Member Soza recommending that the Transportation Board recommend that the City Council adopt an ordinance:

1. Converting the alley located between Mission Inn and University Avenues and Orange Street and the Main Street Pedestrian Mall from two-way traffic operations to one-way northbound travel only within the portion of the alley located north of the Imperial Hardware Lofts entrance driveway; and
2. Revising Section 10.76.020 of the Riverside Municipal Code to reflect the one-way northbound travel designation for the alley located between Mission Inn and University Avenues and Orange Street and Main Street Pedestrian Mall only within the portion of the alley located north of the Imperial Hardware Lofts entrance driveway.

Motion carried unanimously.

SPEED LIMIT ZONE ESTABLISHMENT – GRATTON STREET

Following discussion motion was made by Member Bullock and seconded by Vice Chair Armas recommending that the Transportation Board recommend that the City Council adopt an ordinance to establish a 30 MPH on Gratton Street from Hermosa Drive to Monroe Street.

Motion carried unanimously, with an amendment to the report to correct Monroe Avenue to Monroe Street.

CITY TRAFFIC ENGINEER UPDATES

Following discussion and without formal motion the Transportation Board unanimously received and ordered filed the oral update regarding recent Council actions.

UPDATES

An update was provided on the interim scooter agreement that went to City Council on February 12, 2019; Engineering Consulting panel approval by City Council on March 5, 2019; SB1 project approvals, emergency closure of westbound Magnolia Avenue between Tyler Street and Polk Street due to leaking water pipes, and Connecting Five Points event on March 16, 2019. Following discussion and without formal motion the Transportation Board unanimously received and ordered filed the update.
