SUBJECT: MEASURE Z – AWARD BID NO. 7797 FOR THE PURCHASE OF THREE CURRENT MODEL BMW R1250 RT-P POLICE MOTORCYCLES FROM RIDE ON POWERSPORTS DBA BMW MOTORCYCLES OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA IN THE AMOUNT OF \$95,741.76.

ISSUE:

Award Bid No. 7797 for the purchase of three current model BMW R1250 RT-P Police Motorcycles to Ride On Powersports dba BMW Motorcycles of Riverside, California in the amount of \$95,741.76.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the City Council award Bid No. 7797 for the purchase of three current model BMW R1250 RT-P Police Motorcycles to Ride On Powersports dba BMW Motorcycles of Riverside, California in the amount of \$95,741.76.

BACKGROUND:

To help address service cuts as well as a portion of the City’s critical unfunded needs, at staff’s recommendation, the Mayor and the City Council placed Measure Z on the November 8, 2016 ballot. The measure authorized a one-cent increase in the City’s sales tax rate and was approved by over 60% of Riverside voters. The collection of the additional one-cent sales tax authorized by voters through Measure Z began on April 1, 2017.

After hearing recommended Measure Z spending options from City staff and the Budget Engagement Committee (BEC), on May 16, 2017 the City Council approved the Measure Z Spending Plan. As part of the Measure Z Spending Plan, the City Council approved funding for a Police Vehicle Replacement and Maintenance Plan.

DISCUSSION:

The General Services - Fleet Division evaluates all vehicle replacement criteria to ensure the efficient management and replacement of vehicles. The Police Department has an immediate

need for three motorcycles, one of which is a replacement for a unit that has exceeded the expected service life as outlined in the table below:

Asset No.	Year	Mileage	Replacement Reason
2401	2014	119,225	Exceeded expected motorcycle service life of 4 years/60,000 miles.

In addition, the Police Department is currently increasing operational capacity which requires the addition of two motorcycles.

On October 27, 2020, the City of Riverside received two proposals in response to Bid No. 7797 for the purchase of three current model BMW R1250 RT-P Police Motorcycles. The lowest responsive bid was Ride On Powersports dba BMW Motorcycles of Riverside, California for a total amount of \$95,741.76.

The Purchasing Manager concurs that the recommended action is in compliance with Purchasing Resolution No. 23256, and the Chief of Police concurs with the recommendation above.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The total fiscal impact of the action is \$95,741.76. Sufficient funds are available in the FY 2020-21 Measure Z Police Department Vehicle Replacement Account No. 8001201-450057.
