Housing Referral

 Counseling in the process of obtaining the necessary types of assistance to live independently (such as caregiver, reader, driver). Maintain a referral list of workers.




<u>Assistive Technology</u>

 Provide AT information regarding availability and funding for current technology that can enhance independent living.



Independent Living Skills

 Assistance in learning or re-learning ways of performing the daily activities needed to live independently, (such as budgeting, using public transit, banking, shopping, etc.



PROGRAMS:

Senior Low Vision

Provides all our services tailored specifically to individuals age 55+ with low vision or blindness.



Residential Access Modification program (RAMP)

Exterior and interior housing modification for improved accessibility. (Eligibility/ income requirements will apply.

Transition Services

We assist consumers that are living in skilled nursing facilities to transition back to the community.



Youth transitions to Independence

Aid youth with disabilities as they transition from school to adult life.

<u>Computer Lab</u>

Computer lab with adaptive software, Assistive Technology, and an advocate to assist individuals with disabilities.
