BACKGROUND

Since 1995, the City has contracted two major areas of service with the Riverside County Department of Animal Services:

- 1. Shelter Services Current agreement terminates in 2035.
- 2. Field Services Current agreement terminates on December 31, 2022.

1. The County is requesting that the City of Riverside forego Title 8 in its entirety, in favor of adopting Ordinances 534, 560, 630, 716, 771 and 878 of the County of Riverside in their entirety.

COUNTY ORDINANCES

The proposed County Ordinances includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- 1. Large animals at large
- 2.Low cost spay and neuter clinics
- 3. Keeping and control of dogs, cats and other animals
- 4. Seizure, impoundment and termination of ownership
- 5. Potentially dangerous and/or vicious animals
- 6. Abatement of noisy animals
