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FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS

- To respond to workers performing essential work during the Covid-19 public health emergency by providing premium pay to eligible workers;
- For the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue due to the Covid-19 public health emergency relative to revenues collected in the most recent full fiscal year prior to the emergency; and
- To make necessary investments in water,
 sewer, or broadband infrastructure.

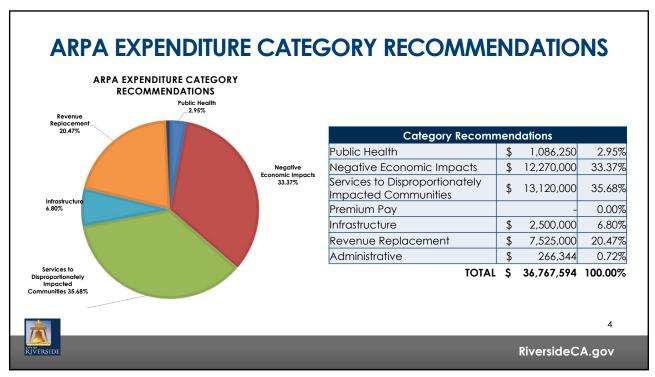
