RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council appoint representatives from the Board of Public Utilities to Western Municipal Water District Joint Committee and San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District Advisory Commission on Water Policy.

BOARD RECOMMENDATION:

On April 11, 2022, the Board of Public Utilities voted unanimously to receive assignments for Fiscal Year 2022/23 standing committees of the Board of Public Utilities made by the Board Chair; and to recommend that City Council appoint representatives to outside organizations as outlined in the report.

BACKGROUND:

Appointing representatives from the Board of Public Utilities to outside organizations is the purview of the City Council upon recommendation by the Board (Ref. Standing Rules 9).

STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT:

This item contributes to **Strategic Priority No. 4 - Environmental Stewardship** and **Goal 4.2** – Sustainably manage local water resources to maximize reliability and advance water reuse to ensure safe, reliable, and affordable water to our community.

- 3. **Fiscal Responsibility** RPU benefits from outside water organization appointments by exploring potential partnerships that can produce cost savings and ensure that regional water issues are addressed in a way that maximizes benefit and utilities funds responsibly.
- 4. **Innovation** RPU representation on outside water organizations and their boards supports regional collaboration and learning both within the City organization and the region to ensure that best practices are utilized, and provides opportunities to participate in regional efforts to ensure water availability, quality, and co-benefits for the City.
- 5. **Sustainability & Resiliency** RPU representation on outside water organizations and their boards contributes to meeting Riverside's water needs through the ability to participate in regional decision-making that impacts Riverside's water resources as well as participate in watershed protection efforts that support clean air, habitat, and endangered species in addition to preserving Riverside's water supply.
