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BACKGROUND

RERC, Springs and Clearwater Power Plants:

- 1. Combined, provide 260 megawatts of electricity
- 2. Operate during the most critical need for electricity
- 3. Numerous emissions tests and environmental compliance activities
- 4. Need technical expertise to support staff's efforts
- 5. New air quality regulations coming

Springs: 36 MW



Clearwater: 28 MW

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REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL 2130

- Very limited number of vendors with expertise to perform the work
- 2. RFP 2130 posted on October 4 and closed on November 2, 2021
 - a. One proposal received from Montrose Air Quality Services, LLC
 - b. Not unusual with historical efforts for obtaining specialized services
 - c. Limited options for certified test companies and expertise with SCAQMD regulations
- 3. Proposal evaluated based on selection criteria
 - a. Qualifications (35%-35 points)
 - b. Pricing (30%-30 points)
 - c. Experience, Approach, Methodology (35%-35 points)

MONTROSE AIR QUALITY SERVICES, LLC

- 1. A California-based subsidiary of Montrose Environmental Group, Inc.
- 2. Large fleet of certified mobile laboratories
- 3. Historical knowledge with SCAQMD regulations
- 4. Emissions testing optimization saves \$20k per year and reduces plant emissions (9 less start-ups each year)

- Annual budget developed from an estimated number of emissions test each year, plus 400 hours of asneeded consulting services
- 2. Only actual expenditures will be charged to the Generation Budget
- Each fiscal year, staff will review the budget and seek Board Approval through the Annual PO Approval process

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Riverside Public Utilities Board:

- 1. Approve a Professional Consultant Services Agreement with Montrose Environmental Group, Inc. of North Little Rock, Arkansas to provide emissions testing and environmental consulting services for an initial five-year term, with three optional one-year extensions in the amount of \$1,347,530; and
- Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to execute the agreement with Montrose Environmental Group, Inc., including making minor and non-substantive changes, and to execute contract amendments for the one-year extensions subject to the availability of budgeted funds.



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
