ISSUE:

Recognize the department's employees and their efforts.

RECOMMENDATION:

BACKGROUND:

Each year the American Public Works Association promotes National Public Works Week. This year, Public Works Week is May 15th to the 21st and the theme is "Ready & Resilient." The APWA celebrates that, "Public Works team members are always ready to serve their communities, and resilient as ever in their abilities to pick themselves up off the ground after encountering challenges."

DISCUSSION:

The Public Works Department is responsible for delivering many of the core services that residents and businesses rely on daily. From providing clean, safe, and well-maintained roadways to handling the disposal or reuse of solid waste and wastewater, our staff of 264 are dedicated to providing the highest level of service possible, 365 days a year. During this time, we would like to recognize the efforts of our employees who are the backbone of our department responding to over 53,000 service requests annually providing services in:

Furthermore, the department aligns with each of the five Cross-Cutting Threads as follows:

- Community Trust The Public Works Department endeavors to involve the community in its work through inclusive engagement efforts and is responsive to community requests for service.
- 2. **Equity** The Public Works Department has assisted in bringing millions of dollars in grant revenues to fund infrastructure projects in disadvantaged communities.
- 3. **Fiscal Responsibility** The Public Works Department relies heavily upon leveraging existing resources towards grant funding opportunities, for example, \$250,000 of the limited sidewalk installation budget was recently leveraged to secure an additional \$250,000 in SB 821 grant fund.
- 4. **Innovation** The Public Works Department has recently installed new bicycle facility types, covered stormwater channels to provide pedestrian walkways, installed an award-winning stormwater diversion facility, and developed unique pedestrian & bicycle master planning documents, amongst other innovations.
- 5. **Sustainability & Resiliency** The Public Works Department works to ensure newly-installed infrastructure and preventative maintenance practices will help Riverside to remain resilient in the face of rising temperatures and changing weather patterns.
