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LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

- 1. Assembly Bill (AB) 1890 was adopted in 1996, and required publicly owned utilities to collect and spend Public Benefits Charge funds for low-income assistance, energy efficiency and conservation programs, renewable energy, and research, development, and demonstration projects.
- 2. Senate Bill (SB) 756 was adopted in 2021, and expanded the definition of low-income for the purposes of the Energy Savings Assistance Program from 200% of the federal poverty level guidelines to 250%.



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BACKGROUND

- SHARE program established in 1989
 Originally funded from direct customer contributions
- 2. May 22, 2018: City Council Approved First Enhancement
 - a. Expanded to 200% of the federal poverty level
 - b. \$14 per month electric bill credit (up to \$168 per year)
 - c. \$2.25 per month water bill credit (up to \$27 per year)
 - d. Five (5) one-year automatic renewal periods
 - e. Funding: \$2.8 million
 - i. \$2,550,000 Direct customer assistance
 - ii. \$ 250,000 County Administration fee



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BACKGROUND

- 3. Aligned with Electric and Water Rate Increases City Council approved:
 - a. July 2, 2019 \$14.50 electric, \$2.50 water
 - b. July 21, 2020 \$15.00 electric, \$2.75 water
 - c. March 23, 2021 emergency/deposit assistance increased from \$150 to \$250
 - d. August 23, 2021 \$15.50 electric, \$3.00 water

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DISCUSSION

- 1. Increase Water Monthly Credit
 - a. Next water rate increase scheduled for July 1, 2022
 - b. Increase water monthly credit from \$3.00 to \$3.25 (up to \$39 per year, 7% increase)
- 2. Increase Electric Monthly Credit
 - a. Next electric rate increase scheduled for January 1, 2023
 - b. Increase electric monthly credit from \$15.50 to \$16.00 (up to \$192 per year, 4% increase)



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DISCUSSION

- 3. Increase Income Eligibility
 - a. Increase income eligibility from 200% of the federal poverty level guidelines to 250%.
 - b. Participation may double from the present average of 4,000 approved customers

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RECOMMENDATIONS

That the City Council:

- 1. Approve an increase of the Sharing Households Assist Riverside's Energy Program's Electric Monthly Credit from \$15.50 per month to \$16.00 and Water Monthly Credit from \$3.00 to \$3.25 to align with electric and water rate increases for Fiscal Year 2022/23; and
- 2. Approve to update the Sharing Households Assist Riverside's Energy Program guidelines from 200% of the federal poverty level guidelines to 250%.



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
