RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO LEVY AND COLLECT ASSESSMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023 WITHIN LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE DISTRICT NO. 88-1 (SYCAMORE HIGHLANDS), APPROVING REPORT, AND GIVING NOTICE OF THE TIME AND PLACE OF A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED ASSESSMENTS.

WHEREAS, the City Council ("City Council") of the City of Riverside, California ("City"), has established Landscape Maintenance District No. 88-1 (Sycamore Highlands, formerly known as Lusk Highlander or Highlander) (hereafter referred to as "District"), pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, as set forth in Part 2 (commencing with section 22500) of Division 15 of the Streets and Highways Code; and

WHEREAS, on February 15, 2022, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 23824, which initiated proceedings to levy and collect assessments for fiscal year 2022-2023 within the District, and ordered the preparation of an engineer's report regarding assessments to be levied and collected within the District for fiscal year 2022-2023 to pay the costs of the maintenance and servicing of public landscaping and appurtenant facilities; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Resolution No. 23824, Webb Municipal Finance, LLC, has prepared and filed the engineer's report ("Report") with the City Clerk, and the Report has been presented to and considered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the adjustment to the maximum annual assessment was originally based on the cumulative percentage increase, if any, in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the Los Angeles-Riverside-Orange County, California Standard Metropolitan Statistical area ("Index") published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor, which has been discontinued; and

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby finds and determines that the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario Index is the most comparable index and has generally replaced the prior index in Riverside County; and

WHEREAS, the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario Index has a beginning value of 100 and accordingly, the City Council finds and determines that the maximum assessment per EDU shall be

- (c) The maintenance and/or servicing of the aforementioned improvements; and
- (d) The acquisition of land for park, recreational, or open space purposes.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Assessment District.</u> The distinctive designation of the District is: Landscape Maintenance District No. 88-1 (Sycamore Highlands). The boundaries of the assessment district are described and shown in the Report.

Section 5. Report. The Report, which is on file with the City Clerk, and which has been presented to the City Council at the meeting at which this resolution is adopted, is approved. Reference is made to the Report for a full and detailed description of the improvements, the boundaries of the District, and any zones therein, and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land therein for fiscal year 2022-2023.

Section 6. Hearing. The time and place of the hearing required by sections 22624 through 22629 of the Streets and Highways Code is set for 3:00 p.m. on July 5, 2022, at the Art Pick Council Chamber of the City of Riverside at 3900 Main Street in the City of Riverside. A virtual meeting may be held and viewed a www.engageriverside.com. The agenda for the meeting will be published on June 23, 2022, and will indicate if the hearing is virtual or in-person. A copy of the agenda will be available at www.engageriverside.com or may be requested from the City Clerk's Office at City_Clerk@riversideca.gov.

Section 7. Notice of Hearing. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at 3:00 p.m. on July 5, 2022, the City Council will hold an in-person and/or virtual public hearing with regard to the assessments to be levied on assessable lots and parcels in the District for fiscal year 2022-2023, as set forth in the Report on file with the City Clerk.

Any interested person may file a written protest with the City Clerk prior to the conclusion of the hearing, which protest must state all grounds of objection and describe the property within the District owned by any such person.
