- Feedback was solicited to prioritize activities.






HOMELESS HOUSING, ASSISTANCE AND PREVENTION ROUND 3 (HHAP-3)

- \$1-billion-dollar block grant authorized by AB-140
- The City of Riverside's allocation is \$8,433,288.22
- 7% may be utilized for administration of grant program
- At least 10% must be allocated to programs and services for youth
- Local homelessness action plan that were agendized at a regular meeting of the governing body, and included receiving public comment and the applications are due on June 30, 2022

HHAP-3

- Requires applicants to establish regional goals with overlapping jurisdictions
- Outcome goals must be developed with regional baseline data from the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)
- Outcome goals should be ambitious but achievable. Regions who achieve outcome goals will be eligible for the \$180 million in bonus funding. The Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council will determine bonus award allocations based on the recipient's proportionate share of the state's homeless population as reported in the 2019 PIT count

HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM – AMERICAN RECOVERY PLAN (HOME-ARP)

- City of Riverside allocation: \$4,335,583
- Must develop a HOME-ARP Allocation Plan that will become part of the City's FY 2021 HUD Annual Action Plan by substantial amendment
- Eligible activities:
 - Production or preservation of affordable housing
 - Tenant-Based Rental Assistance
 - Supportive Services
 - Homeless Prevention
 - Purchase and development of non-congregate shelter
