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
- 1. July 25, 2016 Board of Public Utilities recommended that City Council approve Work Order 1611216 and development of Citywide Streetlight LED Conversion Program
- 2. September 6, 2016 City Council approved Work Order 1611216 and development of City-wide Streetlight LED Conversion Program
- 3. December 10, 2018 Board recommended City Council adopt the Streetlight Program and Policies Update and Design Guide
- 4. February 5, 2019 City Council adopted the Streetlight Program and Policies Update and Design Guide



#### **BACKGROUND CONT.** 5. June 24, 2019 - Board approved Work Order 1916742 and awarded Bid No. RPU-7643 for the procurement of 27,000 luminaires for Phase 1 LED Conversion Project 6. July 22, 2019 - Board approved the Master Professional Consultant Services Agreements for the Energy Delivery Consultant Panel in response to RFP No.1890 for a threeyear term, with option to extend for additional one-year terms 7. December 13, 2021, the Board awarded Bid No. RPU-7810 to SASCO, of Fullerton, California, for the Citywide LED **Conversion Project Phase 1** 3 RIVERSIDE **RiversideCA.gov**

## DISCUSSION

- 1. Phase 2 of the LED Conversion Project will include Historic Districts or Neighborhood Conservation Areas in the City of Riverside
- 2. Conversion will replace luminaires mounted on existing post top poles
- 3. Title 20 of the Municipal Code requires special review of the planned improvements for each of the Historic Districts to assure aesthetics are appropriate and approved within those guidelines
- 4. CEQA and Title 20 COA documentation preparation will ensure the anticipation and mitigation planning of any possible negative environmental impacts
- 5. Six months to complete Study



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# **RFP RESULTS**

- 1. RFP No. 2160 was posted on the City's Online Bid System January 14, 2022, and closed on February 8, 2022
- Seven (7) vendors, pre-qualified by the Riverside Public Utilities (RPU) Consultants Panel under the category CEQA experience, were invited to submit proposals and three (3) proposals were received
- 3. Staff reviewed the proposals and deemed TRC Solutions, of Irvine, California, to be the overall responsive and responsible proposer

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
