

1 RESOLUTION NO.

2 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE,  
3 CALIFORNIA, APPROVING APPLICATION(S) FOR PER CAPITA  
4 GRANT FUNDS

5 WHEREAS, the State Department of Parks and Recreation has been delegated the  
6 responsibility by the Legislature of the State of California for the administration of the Per Capita  
7 Grant Program, setting up necessary procedures governing application(s); and

8 WHEREAS, said procedures established by the State Department of Parks and Recreation  
9 require the grantee's Governing Body to certify by resolution the approval of project application(s)  
10 before submission of said applications to the State; and

11 WHEREAS, the grantee will enter into a contract(s) with the State of California to  
12 complete project(s);

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of Riverside, California,  
14 hereby:

- 15 1. Approves the filing of project application(s) for Per Capita program grant  
16 project(s).
- 17 2. Certifies that said grantee has or will have available, prior to commencement of  
18 project work utilizing Per Capita funding, sufficient funds to complete the project(s).
- 19 3. Certifies that the grantee has or will have sufficient funds to operate and maintain the  
20 project(s).
- 21 4. Certifies that all projects proposed will be consistent with the park and recreation  
22 element of the City's general or recreation plan (PRC §80063(a)).
- 23 5. Certifies that these funds will be used to supplement, not supplant, local  
24 revenues in existence as of June 5, 2018 (PRC §80062(d)).
- 25 6. Certifies that it will comply with the provisions of §1771.5 of the State Labor  
26 Code.
- 27 7. (PRC §80001(b)(8)(A-G)) To the extent practicable, as identified in the "Presidential  
28 Memorandum--Promoting Diversity and Inclusion in Our National Parks, National Forests, and  
Other Public Lands and Waters," dated January 12, 2017, the City will consider a range of actions  
that include, but are not limited to, the following:

1 (A) Conducting active outreach to diverse populations, particularly minority,  
2 low-income, and disabled populations and tribal communities, to increase awareness within  
3 those communities and the public generally about specific programs and opportunities.

4 (B) Mentoring new environmental, outdoor recreation, and conservation  
5 leaders to increase diverse representation across these areas.

6 (C) Creating new partnerships with state, local, tribal, private, and  
7 nonprofit organizations to expand access for diverse populations.

8 (D) Identifying and implementing improvements to existing programs to increase  
9 visitation and access by diverse populations, particularly minority, low-income, and disabled  
10 populations and tribal communities.

11 (E) Expanding the use of multilingual and culturally appropriate materials in  
12 public communications and educational strategies, including through social media  
13 strategies, as appropriate, that target diverse populations.

14 (F) Developing or expanding coordinated efforts to promote youth engagement  
15 and empowerment, including fostering new partnerships with diversity-serving and youth-  
16 serving organizations, urban areas, and programs.

17 (G) Identifying possible staff liaisons to diverse populations.

18 8. Agrees that to the extent practicable, the project(s) will provide workforce  
19 education and training, contractor and job opportunities for disadvantaged communities (PRC  
20 §80001(b)(5)).

21 9. Certifies that the grantee shall not reduce the amount of funding otherwise  
22 available to be spent on parks or other projects eligible for funds under this division in its  
23 jurisdiction. A one-time allocation of other funding that has been expended for parks or other  
24 projects, but which is not available on an ongoing basis, shall not be considered when calculating  
25 a recipient's annual expenditures. (PRC §80062(d)).

26 10. Certifies that the grantee has reviewed, understands, and agrees to the General  
27 Provisions contained in the contract shown in the Procedural Guide.

1           11. Delegates the authority to the City Manager, or designee to conduct all negotiations,  
2 sign and submit all documents, including, but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments,  
3 and payment requests, which may be necessary for the completion of the grant scope(s).

4           12. Agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules,  
5 regulations and guidelines.
