ADOPT A PARK PROGRAM

The Program

 The Adopt A Park Program allows interested community groups, businesses and individuals to adopt a park through financial donations towards a recreational amenity or construction project or volunteer their time to park clean up and beautification projects.

Department Goal for Program

- Increase partnerships with the community to fully develop the Adopt a Park Program
- Utilize volunteer hours and financial donations to assist in offsetting costs in the areas of park maintenance, park amenities and construction projects.

First Steps

 Compile a working group to assess the program and identify and overcome challenges

Working Group

Work group Members

 Staff from Executive Management, Parks Division, Recreation Division and Administration.

 Members were subject matter experts in the operations of Adopt-A-Park, marketing and sponsorships, volunteer processes,

and policy development.

Working Group Tasks

- Identify challenges and develop solutions
- Draft policy and guidelines for the program



CHALLENGES & SOLUTIONS

Workloads and Time Constraints

- Currently, Adopt-A-Park resides under the Parks Division, with one dedicated Parks Supervisor.
- Due to heavy workload of normal daily operations, there is no time to actively pursue and market the Adopt A Park Program.
- Lack of staffing prevent the Department from fully growing and utilizing the program.

Additional Staff

- Two additional part-time staff members are needed to fully develop the program.
- Assistant Recreation Coordinator and Recreation Leader will focus on coordination of the program, contact with groups and actively out reaching to non-profits and local businesses.



ADOPT A PARK PROGRAM POLICY

Program Tiers

Tier 1 (Maintenance)

- Trash Pickup
- Graffiti/Gum Removal
- Minor Maintenance

Tier 2 (Beautification)

- Painting
- Landscape Planting

Tier 3 (In-Kind and Monetary Donations)

- Donations-Clay bricks/brick dust, bases, nets, trash cans, bike racks etc.
- Monetary Donations of \$5,000 or more for park maintenance
- Monetary Donations of \$5,000 or more towards park projects

- Social Media Recognition
- Annual Commission Recognition

Annual Re-Commitment

 Groups Re-Apply each year to maintain Adopt A Park Status
