## **Pickleball Courts:**

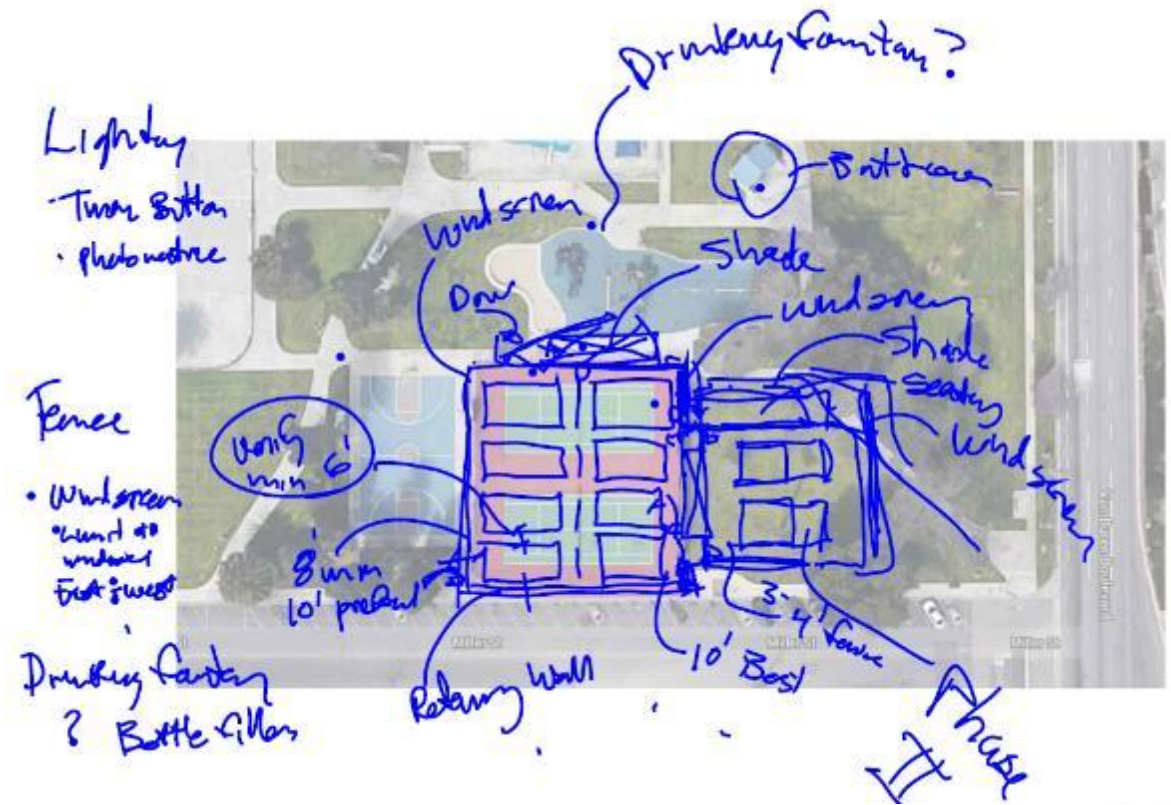
20' wide, 44' long

# BUDGET

Estimated Cost	1,040,000
Current Funding	660,000
Additional funding needed	440,000

- Continue to seek funding while project is designed and bid
- Championship court can be constructed in Phase 2
