CULTURAL HERITAGE BOARD DRAFT MINUTES

PLANNING CASE DP-2022-00870 – HISTORIC DESIGNATION – 5050 MYRTLE AVENUE, WARD 3

Proposal by Jarod and Stephanie DeAnda to consider a Historic Designation request for designation of the Woolley Residence as a City Landmark. Scott Watson, Historic Preservation Officer, presented the staff report. Stephanie DeAnda, stated they were in agreement with the recommended designation. There were no public comments, the public hearing was closed. Following discussion it was moved by Board Member Ferguson and seconded by Board Member Carter to recommend that the City Council: Determine that Planning Case DP-2022-00870 (Historic Designation) for the 1) designation of the Woolley Residence as a City Landmark, is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to Sections 15061(b)(3) (Common Sense Rule) and 15308 (Actions by Regulatory Agencies for Protection of the Environment), as the proposal will have no significant effect on the environment, identifies the structure as a cultural resource, and preserves the historic character of a cultural resource; and 2) Approve Planning Case DP-2022-00870 (Historic Designation), based on the facts of findings in the staff report, and designate the Woollev Residence as a City Landmark.

Chair Gamble advised of the appeal period.

City Council public hearing is required for final approval of the designation.
