






PERFORMANCE/ ONE STOP SHOP

One Stop Shop (OSS) Pivot to Virtual Services

- Virtual development services now offered to customers:
 - Apply for permits and planning projects
 - Pay fees online
 - Submit electronic plans instead of paper
 - Get real-time project status and updates
 - Schedule inspections and see results
 - Easily communicate with city staff
 - Perform extensive search capabilities
- 40,000+ virtual customers served over the past year
- 80% electronic plan submittals vs. 20% paper, 11,000+ reviews completed virtually
- 94% on time with plan check services
- 6,000+ electronic permits issued
- 10% increase in total OSS customers served (FY 19/20 vs. FY 20/21)
- 56% of customers remain virtual since fully reopening the OSS on 03/2021
