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BACKGROUND


- 1. In 2006, parking enforcement was added to the City's Street Sweeping Program (Program) in phases;
- 2. By 2011, the phasing in of parking enforcement was completed;
- 3. The Program continues to sweep areas with curb and gutter twice a month in most areas;



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DISCUSSION: PART 1 – EXISTING PRACTICES

"Friendly Parking Enforcement" Business Practices

- 1. Citation dismissal as first-time warnings through appeals process for:
 - a. Visitors & residents that forgot to move their car during street sweeping;
 - b. New Riverside residents; and
 - c. Landscape, pool maintenance or construction vehicles conducting business.



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DISCUSSION: PART 1 – EXISTING PRACTICES

No Citations Issued -

- 2. Thanksgiving, Christmas, & New Year weeks
- 3. Certain routine circumstances that include: a. Curbs in front of businesses & perimeter of
 - corbs in nom or bosinesses & perimerer o schools;
 - b. Vehicles displaying a valid disabled person parking placard; and
 - a. Areas where signs not clearly posted, missing or have been vandalized.



4. Resident request for funerals, parties, graduations
or construction (804 received in 12 months)

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"FRIENDLY PARKING ENFORCEMENT" EVALUATION

- 1. The Riverside Municipal Code was not revised to address "Friendly Parking Enforcement" practices since the inception of the Street Sweeping Program in 2011.
- 2. Street sweeping routes cannot be serviced properly & consistently due to non-enforcement around curb fronting businesses, schools & vehicles displaying disabled person placards.
- 3. Re-commencement of parking enforcement in accordance with the Riverside Municipal Code is necessary.
- 4. 90-day phase-in period to distribute flyers, update 311 Call Center, provide social media posts & website updates.

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DISCUSSION: PART 2 – PROPOSED POLICY ESTABLISHMENT

Public Works to establish a policy for the Temporary Suspension of Parking Enforcement requests.

- 1. Require submission of request to Traffic Engineering 5days before the start date of the event to allow review & approval of eligibility;
- 2. Set a maximum event duration of 60 calendar days with one (1) option to extend up to 60 additional days;




DISCUSSION: PART 2 – PROPOSED POLICY ESTABLISHMENT

- 3. Set a maximum of one (1) event at the same physical location per calendar guarter; and
- 4. Requests for more than 120 days shall require Transportation Board review & will not be in effect until granted by City Council.

No consideration will be given to safety zones, such as red zones, fire hydrants, & areas posted as no stopping zones.





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ELECTION PARKING ACCOMMODATIONS


Staff received several complaints that metered parking fees may serve as a potential barrier to voting. Staff recommends amending the Riverside Municipal Code authorizing the City Manager to permit parking without imposition of the time limits or fees established when a need exists due to special events or meetings include "elections".






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RECOMMENDATIONS

4. Direct staff to re-commence routine issuance of citations related to first-time warnings, holiday weeks, school & business frontages and disabled person parking placards with a minimum 90-day warning period.

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
