RESOLUTION NO. 1 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, 2 CALIFORNIA TO SUPPORT FURTHER UNDERGROUNDING FOR THE RELIABILITY RIVERSIDE TRANSMISSION **PROJECT** 3 IMPLEMENTATION OF AN ACTION PLAN, 4 5 WHEREAS, the City of Riverside is the only city of its size with a single point of connection 6 to the outside power grid, which presents capacity and reliability constraints; and 7 WHEREAS, the California Independent System Operator in 2006 directed Southern California 8 Edison ("SCE") to build a second point of connection; and 9 WHEREAS, the City of Riverside and SCE proposed the Riverside Transmission Reliability 10 Project ("RTRP"), connecting SCE's Mira Loma substation to the City of Riverside, which the City 11 of Riverside approved, in addition to an Environmental Impact Report, in 2012; and 12 WHEREAS, on April 15, 2015, SCE applied to the California Public Utilities Commission ("CPUC") for a certificate of public convenience and necessity ("CPCN") for SCE to construct the 13 RTRP; and 14 WHEREAS, the City of Jurupa Valley opposed the RTRP and intervened in the CPCN process, 15 which proposed undergrounding the RTRP through that city; and, 16 WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020, based upon a supplemental EIR, the CPUC granted the CPCN 17 to SCE; and 18 19 WHEREAS, on May 10, 2022, the City Council of the City of Riverside authorized an 20 assessment/study regarding further undergrounding of the RTRP; and 21 WHEREAS, on September 15, 2022, California Strategies, LLC was retained to prepare a 22 study of undergrounding the remaining 5 miles of the proposed 230kV transmission line; and 23 WHEREAS, at a special meeting on October 20, 2022, City of Riverside staff and California 24 Strategies, LLC presented its October 14, 2022 Fatal Flaw Analysis Summary ("Report") to the City 25 of Riverside Financial Performance and Budget Committee; and 26 WHEREAS, the Report recommends an Action Plan with a five-step process to support further 27 undergrounding of the Riverside Transmission Reliability Project; and 28

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Riverside has read and considered the Report, and seeks to support further undergrounding of the Riverside Transmission Reliability Project and implement an Action Plan, as set forth in the Report.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: The City of Riverside supports further undergrounding of the Riverside Transmission Reliability Project and implement an Action Plan as described in the Report, which includes following five steps to modify the Project.

Section 2:

- A. A Task Force is hereby created.
- B. The goal of the Task Force is to achieve undergrounding as quickly as possible. The Task Force shall complete all necessary organizational efforts including stakeholder identification, agency outreach, and pre-construction schedule development. Key milestones include the following actions:
 - 1. Create a coalition of local and state elected officials who support the project;
 - 2. Establish a working relationship with SCE aimed at an agreement to proceed with CPUC approvals;
 - 3. Contact CAISO and FERC to determine what approvals may be needed;
 - 4. Establish links and work plans aimed at meeting the requirements of SCE and agency relationships; and
 - 5. Develop a pre-construction schedule that considers anticipated approval timelines and required Task Force activities.
- C. The Task Force shall explore unconventional funding sources such as pilot funding programs, state funding, separate funding through the State budget process, etc., as well as federal funding, should the CPUC not allow funding from transmission access charges.
- D. The Task Force will identify the modified project's new environmental impacts and select the appropriate variation of an EIR to be completed.

3	funding sources.
