- The City of Riverside seeks to inspire everyone through meaningful Arts and Cultural experiences
- The Public Works Department services nearly 400 traffic signals citywide – the signal equipment cabinets are excellent canvases for public art

DISCUSSION

- In April 2022 volunteers from Sandals Church painted 12 signal cabinets across the City
- The project has been well received by the community
- Public Works is seeking to work with the artists, the community and Arts & Cultural Affairs to paint signal cabinets using specialized paints
 and anti-graffiti coatings

DISCUSSION

- Riverwalk Parkway was selected as an opportunity to expand deployment of public art
- The Riverwalk community has expressed interest in the following categories of artwork to be deployed:
 - Active Lifestyle (45%)
 - Local Wildlife (27%)
 - Colorful Landscape Scenes (23%)
 - Other (5%)


DISCUSSION
