BACKGROUND

- 1. The Active Transportation Program seeks to enhance public health and achieve equity-oriented outcomes through the deployment of biking and walking infrastructure
- 2. The City has participated in the ATP program with multiple successes since its inception in 2014
- 3. On June 7, 2022 the City Council authorized submittal of a \$3.5M grant application for the Civil Rights Walk

DISCUSSION

- 1. Project would be similar to the Boston Freedom Trail
- 2. Would use technology such as "Guide By Cell" or similar
- 3. The Civil Rights Walk features a core 1.8 mile loop with thermoplastic markings routing walkers to 18 points of interest
- 4. The expanded 2.9 mile loop features 7 points of interest

DISCUSSION: KEY PROJECT COMPONENTS

- 1. Reconstruct 170 Linear Feet of sidewalk;
- 2. Reconstruct 87 pedestrian ramps;
- 3. Enhance 76 individual crosswalks;
- 4. Install Accessible Pedestrian Systems and Leading Pedestrian Intervals at approximately 13 traffic signals;



DISCUSSION: KEY PROJECT COMPONENTS

- 5. Install 10 decorative traffic signal wraps;
- Install 1.8 miles of thermoplastic wayfinding;
- 7. Install 4.7 miles of wayfinding signage; and
- 8. Enhance 4 intersections with LED Signage



DISCUSSION: MATCH FUNDING

- 1. Project preliminarily recommended for \$2,340,000 partial funding by RCTC, full recommendation to SCAG in January
- 2. Funding gap of \$876,000 for construction in FY 2025/26
- 3. Measure A is an appropriate source of matching funds
